#### From the Pastor's Desk:

In today's Gospel passage, a leper confronts Jesus with a challenge: he knows Jesus could cure him if he really wanted to. Perhaps Jesus could have taken offense at this boldness, but he was moved to pity. Jesus assures the man

that he does indeed want to cure him, and then he does so. It is significant that after Jesus heard what the leper wanted and gave it to him, the leper did not return the favor. Jesus asked him not to talk about the cure, but to go to the priest and offer what the law of Moses prescribed. As we are told in the first reading, only a priest could declare a person clean or unclean of leprosy. Why didn't the man do what Jesus asked? Was he afraid the priest would not declare him clean? Did he feel a clean bill of health from the priest was not necessary? Jesus asked him to follow the Jewish law, and he didn't. We are not told what happened to him as a result of his disobedience. but we learn that the consequences for Jesus were trou-

We went away with the hope to change our attitude for those children who feel lost or excluded and not interested in education because of lack of parental help or too influenced by television and its promiscuity. We hope to change our attitude and reach out and listen with more compassion to those who have "chips on their shoulder." We want to respond by saying, "I'll pray for you!" We will try to replace apathy with compassion and not judge by appearances.

Scripture Focus: According to Jewish law, lepers were considered unclean and outcasts from society. Yet in today's Gospel, Jesus immediately responds to a leper's request for healing. Jesus had great respect for the Law of Moses so he told the leper to fulfill the cleansing requirements by offering sacrifice and appearing before the priest. Jesus orders him to tell no one who had cured him, but the leper ignores Jesus' command and tells everyone what happened. In spite of the growing difficulties of his ministry, Jesus continues healing and preaching. He was able to proceed because people had faith in him.

Life Focus: \* Jesus reaches out to these outcasts. What groups do you have the most difficulty accepting?

- \* Relate a time when you were moved with compassion toward someone who was considered "unclean."
- \* Describe a time when you recognized and accepted another person's ability to help you.
