### From the Pastor's Desk:

Which is the greater feat - to forgive sins or heal paralysis? Which is the greater gift - to be forgiven of sins or healed of an illness? Certainly, a physical healing is very dramatic, but Jesus only healed the man in today's Gospel

after he had forgiven his sins. In fact, he only healed his paralysis to prove that he could forgive sins. When Jesus told the man, "Child, your sins are forgiven," do you think he and his friends were disappointed? Would you be disappointed, or would you receive this forgiveness as the generous gift that it is? In today's first reading from Isaiah, God announces that he's doing something new; he's going to wipe out the sins of his people. And it seems that God already knows what his people might think about this. They have already wearied him by their sins and their failure to ask for help. So, God does indeed wipe out their offenses, but he does it for his own sake, whether they ask him to or not! Could it be that they - and we don't know what we really need most?

Ultimately faith is not in the head or the heart but in the action of a sustained commitment."

He then says this about **Prayer**: "All great spiritual writers give one ultimate rule and it's not about method, style or content. It's: **Show Up!** Don't ever give up! Don't ever stop going to prayer! As long as you persevere in going to prayer, eventually God will break through. Don't ever stop trying! That's true for all our relationships."

**Our Prayer:** Heavenly Father, beneath the cure of the paralytic is the act of forgiveness. Help us to leave our gifts at the altar and seek forgiveness of our brothers and sisters, so that we may make a more perfect gift of praise and glory to You. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

### **Small Church Community**

Scripture Focus: On the surface this seems to be the story of an ordinary healing miracle by Jesus. But beneath the physical sure is the extraordinary act of forgiveness of sins. Only God can forgive sin. Jesus, having the spirit of God upon him and being the Holy One of God, is able to forgive sin. His cure of the man's lameness dramatizes the greater cure of the soul. Through this action Jesus declares that "...the Son of Man has the authority to forgive sins." It would have been easy merely to say, "your sins are forgiven" the physical cure gave public evidence of Jesus' power over the forces of evil. Life Focus: \* What helps me realize God's continuous love and forgiveness? \* When have you experienced forgiveness? When have you forgiven another? \* Recall a time when you made a special effort to help someone in difficulty. How did you make "a hole in the roof" and bring that person healing? \* What generally keeps you from forgetting a hurt even after you have forgiven the offender? \* Remember a time when you were forgiven for a wrong you did. Explain how the forgiveness also brought you healing in mind and heart.
