From the Pastor's Desk:

Today's passage from Genesis can seem troubling if we don't know its context. First God tells Abraham to sacrifice his son, Isaac; then at the last minute God stops him from doing so. What kind of game is God playing here? At the

time this story was first told, human sacrifice was a common practice. Local tribes bargained with their gods by offering beloved children, slain on altars of worship. Is this what the God of Israel wanted of his people too? By his actions with Abraham, God made it very clear that he did not require or even desire human sacrifice. However, as we can see in the second reading and the Gospel, God also made it very clear that he would sacrifice his own Son to save us. No sacrifice we could make would be enough. And lest we wonder how great the sacrifice would be, we hear it in God's own words: Jesus is his "beloved Son."

In line with Lent, our Seniors had their annual "miniretreat, and if you heard the pulpit announcement, all parishioners were invited. About 100 of us attended one of our best retreats given by Fr. Frank Ferrante, Claritian Missionary and Fr. Jim Halley. We were challenged to reflect on our "core beliefs" with very meaningful spiritual music sprinkled in. Only one regret, we did not record it.

Prayer After Reception of Communion: What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart. That which is given to us in time, be our healing for all eternity. May Your Body which we have eaten and Blood which we have drunk cleave to our very souls. Grant that no trace of sin be found in us which these pure and holy mysteries have renewed. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
