From the Pastor's Desk:

This year we listen to the story of Christ's passion and death as told by St. Mark. One unique detail in Mark's Gospel is found at chapter 14, verses 51-52. At the time of Jesus' arrest, soldiers tried to seize one of his followers - a

young man wearing nothing but a linen cloth. Terrified, the man left the cloth behind and ran away naked. There is an old tradition that claims the young man might have been Mark himself. No matter who he was, the story conveys how frightened Jesus' followers were and how desperate and confusing the situation was. Whether he was telling on himself or someone else, Mark clearly was saying, "Try to imagine how awful all of this was!" You'll notice, too, that in Mark's version, the high priest's servant loses his ear, and Jesus does not heal him as he does in the Gospel of Luke. We are offered no relief from the pain and violence of this awful scene. We must face what our sins have cost.

DEATH & LIFE

From Deacon Don's Desk:



Why do we cover crosses and images during Lent? Crosses & statues are symbols. Symbols are visible things which represent something else that is invisible. Put another way: "Symbols point to a **deeper** meaning." We try to under-

stand the greatness of God and He lowers Himself to sacrifice for us. The cross represents the outpouring of God's love and forgiveness to and for us. We cover the cross and we are in a desert wasteland - where is the God that shows His love for us? The veil makes us realize how empty our lives would be without Jesus & Mary. The statues of the saints too are covered. One priest said, "We veil statues & images because all the merits of the saints we possibly obtain are only gained after Christ's death on the cross." Biblical references support through John 5: 18 "For this reason they tried all the more to kill Him." And again John 8: 58-59 "Amen, I say to you, before Abraham came to be I AM. So they picked up stones to throw at Him, but Jesus hid & went out of the temple area."

Covering crosses and images is a form of "fasting" from sacred depictions which represent the paschal glory - that for which we long.

Our Prayer: Heavenly Father, in every Eucharist let me offer myself to You with all my joys & sorrows & in union with Jesus. Grant that with every Eucharist I participate in, I may know, love & live the Mass more each day. Amen.

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence: one full meal ages 19-59 inclusive, no meat age 14 and over. If one is seriously ill, he/she is not bound to fast or abstain from meat. No fasting would also apply to those doing heavy manual labor.

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: Mark's Gospel, more than the other Gospels, shows the human struggle and suffering of Jesus. Jesus seems to feel abandoned at the worst point. Mark's community, undergoing persecution, needed to make sense of the suffering in their lives. They needed to discover who Jesus was as Messiah. Throughout the Gospel, we get hints and glimpses of who Jesus is. Today we come to the story of the Passion itself. Mark finally answers the question of who Jesus is only at the end, when the centurion proclaims: "Clearly this man was the Son of God." Jesus' identity as Messiah is only fully revealed when he dies on the cross.

Life Focus: * Recall a time when life didn't make sense at all. What, if anything, kept you trusting? * Remember a time when you helped someone who was carrying a heavy burden. * Recall a time in your life when someone helped you through a burdensome time. * Peter denied Jesus threefold. Recall a time when you found it hard to take a stand for the values of Christ. * When were you treated unfairly and you felt you didn't deserve it?

Reverencing the Sacred Blood - The Church encourages us to receive both the Sacred Body and the Sacred Blood in Holy Communion. This is how Christ instituted it. This is the fuller sign of this sacrificial meal. Sometimes, there are reasons we do not receive from the cup. Perhaps we are sick and out of courtesy want to avoid the possibility of sharing our illness with others. Still, simply ignoring the cup and walking past does not honor Christ in his real presence there. One possibility is to take the cup, acknowledge it with a bow of the head and then return it to the minister without drinking. This honors Christ's presence in the sacred cup and also maintains the reverence of the communion procession.


