From the Pastor's Desk:

We don't like to think about sin, and we surely had many reminders of it during Lent, so it may be surprising or even troubling that all three of today's Scripture readings speak about our sinfulness and need to be forgiven. Make no

mistake, the church reminds us today, Jesus suffered and died, and he did it to save us from sin. Does this focus lead to what some people facetiously call "Catholic guilt"? On the contrary! Knowing we are sinners, and knowing Jesus died to save us is not a cause for guilt. "Peace be with you," Jesus says. Because of him, we can be at peace. Today's responsorial psalm truly is our response to these readings: "Lord, let your face shine on us... As soon as I lie down, I fall peacefully asleep, for you alone, O Lord, bring security to my dwelling."

From Deacon Don's Desk:

We come from Easter, to make you a "believing Thomas," now to the Emmaus story. We have come from doubting by putting our hand into His side and now having our eyes opened to His Resurrection in the breaking of

the bread.

Now, in faith, we come to listen and be still with Him in the Blessed Sacrament. COME and "spend one hour with Me." Jesus beckons us, this Thursday, 6-8 pm.

Pope Paul VI once said, "A visit to the Blessed Sacrament draws us (the faithful) into an ever deeper participation in the Paschal (Easter) Mystery.... Pastors should exhort them (faithful) to this, and set them a good example."

"We live in a society which loves to 'get things done.' We are great doers. But we are not good at reflecting, at meditation on the mysteries we celebrate. Without such meditation, without a life of reflecting prayer, we will never be able to celebrate Mass fully, consciously or actively... Adoration of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament...nourishes our souls and kindles a hunger for the Eucharistic celebration with the Lord..." Fr. James Moroney

Reverencing the Sacred Blood - The Church encourages us to receive both the Sacred Body and the Sacred Blood in Holy Communion. This is how Christ instituted it. This is the fuller sign of this sacrificial meal. Sometimes, there are reasons we do not receive from the cup. Perhaps we are sick and out of courtesy want to avoid the possibility of sharing our illness with others. Still, simply ignoring the cup and walking past does not honor Christ in his real presence there. One possibility is to take the cup, acknowledge it with a bow of the head and then return it to the minister without drinking. This honors Christ's presence in the sacred cup and also maintains the reverence of the communion procession.
