From the Pastor's Desk:

Today's readings are all about belonging. In the First Letter of John we read that those who keep his commandments will remain in Jesus Christ. In the passage from John's Gospel, Jesus himself says we must remain in him and

"bear much fruit" or we will be thrown out and left to die. In contrast, the first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, depicts St. Paul's first attempts to join the church. He was still called Saul then, and his early reputation as a persecutor of Christians led the disciples to distrust him. He knew he needed to remain in Christ and belong to his church, but what could he do if they wouldn't even let him join? Just as Jesus says in the Gospel, it was by his fruits that Paul came to be known as a true disciple.


