# From the Pastor's Desk:

I. What a revelation Peter had! After heated discussions about who should or should not be welcomed into the band of disciples, the early Christian Church, Peter came to this realization: "In truth, I see that God shows no partial-

ity. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." All of today's readings including the responsorial psalm, underscore Peter's statement. All nations have received the saving power of God. Everyone who loves is begotten by God. God is the one who does the choosing. It is not up to us to choose who is to be part of God's kingdom; it is up to us to love one another so that each of us is worthy to remain in God's kingdom.

How might you respond this week? \* When in the last two weeks did you recognize God's love in your life? \* What does it mean in your life to love yourself? What things in you hinder you from loving yourself?

Leftovers from last week's homily: Last Wednesday (5/13), the same Gospel was proclaimed, "I am the true vine you are the branches.....by this is My Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."


We need to allow God to "tend us," to prune away that which gets in our way of being faithful disciples. Why prune roses? To remove the diseased and damaged, to control size & shape, and thus produce the most and best quality. Now apply that to you and me. It still is relevant today isn't it? Confession (reconciliation) removes that which damages us. Mass and acts of charity shape us through the Holy Spirit (that sap that flows through the vine, Jesus, into us the branches) that gives us life.

In our Liturgy of Hours (5/12) St. Cyril of Alexandria (4th century) wrote, "Christ is teaching the same truth by calling himself the vine, since the vine is the parent of its branches and provides their nourishment. ....Like branches growing from a vine, we now draw our life from Christ, and we cling to His holy commandment (to love one another) in order to preserve this life. The Holy Spirit teaches us to discern right from wrong and to act with integrity."

**Our Prayer:** Jesus, humble of heart, give us compassion and kindness; teach us to be patient with everyone. Inspire us to be true neighbors to all in distress. May the Blessed Virgin, Your Mother, pray for all vowed to a life of virginity so as to deepen their dedication to You and the Church. We ask this in Your name. Amen.
