

From Deacon Don's Desk:

In the Order of Prayer, the outline for Ascension (Thursday) of the Lord reads: Jesus commissions His disciples to baptize in His name. reminding them He is always present through His Spirit. The ORDO urges us to "live in a man-

ner worthy of the call we have received" in our own baptism. St. Augustine reflects on the Ascension: Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven, let our hearts ascend with Him....For just as He remained with us even after His ascension, so we too are already in heaven with Him, even though what is promised us has not vet been fulfilled in our bodies. Christ is now exalted above the heavens, but He still suffers on earth all the pain that we, the members of His body, have to bear. He showed this when He cried out, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute Me?" and when He said, "I was hungry and you gave Me food." Why do we on earth not strive to find rest with Him in heaven even now, through faith, hope and love that unites us to Him? He did not leave heaven when He came down to us, nor did He withdraw from us when He went up again into heaven...we are in Him by His grace.

Food for thought: As the farmer, sitting on his porch, said to the traveling salesman trying to sell him a book on how to improve his farm's yield by 10 times, "Young fella, I know how to farm my land 10 times better, my problem is doing it." Question: What problem keeps me from doing God's Word as well as I know how?
