From the Pastor's Desk:

Not everyone could attend the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. And even if you did, there was an awful lot to focus on that evening and those three days of Holy Week. Certainly we celebrated the establishment of

the Holy Eucharist, but there wasn't time to reflect as much as we need to. So today, now that the Easter season has ended and before we return to ordinary time, the church gives us this day to honor and reflect on the meaning of the Holy Eucharist. We are even given an ancient hymn, a sequence, as an extra way to reflect on the mystery and meaning of the Eucharist. Whether we sing the sequence or not, take some time to read and pray with all or part of this hymn. Believed to have been written by St. Thomas Aquinas, it lays out the Catholic Church's teaching about the Eucharist. Clearly, the bread and wine are not just symbols of Christ's body and blood. They *are* the body and blood of Christ.

From Deacon Don's Desk:



Last week we had the feast of the Holy Trinity. I thought it would be good to refresh our Catechism on the "Gifts" and "Fruits" of the Holy Spirit, that third person of the Holy Trinity. Keep in mind: Gifts bear Fruit. The Gifts of the Holy

Spirit are Wisdom, Understanding, Right Judgment, Fear of the Lord (awe of God), Knowledge, Fortitude and Piety (reverence). These yield Fruits which are: Charity, Joy, Peace, Kindness, Long Suffering, Generosity, Equanimity (composure under stress), Patience, Faithfulness, Modesty, Self-control, and Chastity.

Now to the upcoming "Year of the Priest." Father Will has asked that we really focus on vocations and to that end we will strive to have the Cardinal Archbishop's Vocation Prayer in each of the Sunday Missals, and we'll say it together at the end of Mass announcements. The good Pope Benedict XVI has declared the year to begin June 19. We are open to ideas to celebrate and thank our priests who are the ones that bring Eucharist. The Body and Blood comes from our priests. We have taken too long to recognize their true love for God and His people.

Our Prayer: Triune God, grant that I may have a strong living faith in You & in Your divine plan of salvation. Help me to believe so that I may understand & love my Christian heritage. Creator God, help me to see each person, including my spouse, as created in Your image and likeness and look upon them with a deep abiding love. Amen.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

(Based on today's Bible readings)

Adult: How has the Eucharist touched & shaped my life? Child: How can I invite others to learn about Jesus? Teen: In what ways have I practiced the words of Jesus and been bread for others?

Scripture Focus: For Mark, the Last Supper consciously recalls the Passover meal that celebrated God's leading the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt to their own country. In Jesus, a new covenant is formed between God and the people. Jesus uses the Passover symbols of blessing the bread and wine and passing them around. But he goes beyond this to claim the bread as his body and the wine as his blood. As the Letter to the Hebrews explains, Jesus shed his own blood to cleanse us from our sins. We come to worship the living God by heeding and doing everything God has called us to do. In the "blood of the covenant," a new community is formed. The early Christians celebrated the Eucharist with joy. They anticipated the heavenly banquet they would share with Christ and each other.

Life Focus: * Speak of an experience from your life when you were willing to sacrifice for others as Jesus did for us. * *Identify something that you are not able to sacrifice willingly.* * Recall a time when you prepared a special meal. What was the occasion? What were your feelings? * *Imagine not being able to receive the Eucharist.*

The Life and Legacy of Cardinal Timothy Manning

Cardinal Timothy Manning served the Church of southern California for over 55 years. As Auxiliary Bishop and Archbishop of Los Angeles, he ordained 349 priests and confirmed approximately 650,000 people. June 23, 2009, marks the 20th anniversary of the death of this holy and faithful priest and servant of the Gospel.

To mark this occasion, Monsignor Clement Connolly, Pastor of Holy Family Parish and long time secretary for Cardinal Manning, will present a public lecture on the *Life and Legacy of Cardinal Timothy Manning*.
