From the Pastor's Desk:

True disciples of Christ, like his first disciples, and even like the prophets of the Old Covenant, often find themselves where they didn't plan to be, doing things they didn't prepare or expect to do. Worse, they often find a very cool

welcome from those around them. "Don't blame me!" they are tempted to say, as the prophet Amos did before them. "This wasn't my idea!" Amos was a farmer, not a prophet. Likewise, the Twelve sent by Jesus were probably surprised to find themselves walking off without any food or money and with the probability that they would be met with some hostility. It isn't and never will be any different for us, the disciples of Christ today. Saint Paul assures us that God chose us in Christ "to be holy and without blemish." It was God's idea to use you as a disciple in the unique ways that you are called to now. What are you going to do about this call you have received?

From Deacon Don's Desk:



I was contemplating what to say this Sunday and it came to me during my evening prayer. How prophetic is Psalm 49 (the "emptiness of riches"): Last Tuesday, I was on my way to fill my prescription. On the radio was a beautiful

pop song. I changed stations and the same song was on! After changing stations 5 times I realized that the memorial service for Michael Jackson was in progress and every major station was broadcasting it.

Two parts of Psalm 49 spoke out loud to me: "For no man can buy his own ransom, or pay a price to God for his life. The ransom of his soul is beyond him. He cannot buy life without end, nor avoid coming to the grave. He knows that wise men and fools must both perish and leave their wealth to others...in his riches, man lacks wisdom." The antiphon that followed says, "You cannot serve both God and mammon" (material wealth). Then the 3rd antiphon says, "Adoration and glory belong by right to the Lamb who was slain." We ask God to be merciful to all our departed brothers and sisters including Mr. Jackson.

This Sunday's Gospel says "do not take anything with you on the trip except a walking stick." It brings up the question: How dependent am I on "things"?

Admiral Richard Byrd was quoted: "Half the confusion of the world comes from not knowing how little we need."

Our Prayer: Lord, may we never fail to praise You for the fullness of life and salvation You give in the Eucharist. We ask Your blessing upon all our priests who make the Holy Mass possible. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The Twelve are sent to towns of Galilee. It is a trial mission that looks ahead to the Christian mission to the world at large. All Christians are to speak for God in the world, even when the world does not care to listen. Jesus shares with the Twelve his powers over the forces of evil. Jesus says to get moving on this mission right away. The Twelve are to travel light. If they are offered hospitality, they should accept it. It not, they are to shake the dust from their feet, which is what pious Jews did when they returned from unholy territory. Jesus did not tell the Twelve to preach about God's reign. That task belonged to Jesus. They were to be much like John the Baptizer preparing for Jesus' mission. They were happy with their success.

Life Focus: * Describe a time in your life when you were genuinely lacking resources, but the task got done in spite of your poverty. * Share a time when you were able to let go of the disappointment of your failures and get on with your life. * How did you feel when called away on an emergency and you had to leave without any of the usual necessities? * Relate a time in your life when your attitude shifted from "No way, I can't do it" to "I certainly can." What caused the shift?
