From the Pastor's Desk:

We make choices every day. Some are as simple as whether to have toast or cereal for breakfast. Others can have more import, such as which physician to select or how much to spend on home furnishings. Still other choices

can be life changing: where to attend college, and who to marry. Choices always have consequences - some foreseen, and some barely imagined.

In the first reading, Joshua presents a choice to the Hebrew people: choose whom you will serve, the LORD, or other gods. The church pairs this reading with the selection from John to foreshadow the choice that Jesus gives to the Twelve: "Do you also want to leave?"

Peter's response, "Master, to whom shall we go?" characterizes the faith of believers. We have no one else but Christ. He is our way, our truth, our life, and going somewhere else will never satisfy.



From Deacon Don's Desk:



Last Sunday, a Jesuit's homily struck me. Like many homilies they seem to go over our heads, they have meaning at Mass, then "out the door" and it's left behind in the church. I had a note pad, and the one line that struck me was, "take

to heart the words of Panis Angelicus from St. Thomas Aquinas." This song is sung in Latin at many weddings. But, he read the English translation - it was so appropriate for the past few Gospels about the Bread of Life, that I want to share it with you: "Holy and living bread, wondrous food from heaven sent, God's sacrifice foretold now in our hands we hold. Sign and reality, challenge for us to be humble servants to all the poor. God, holy Three-in - One, through this offering of your Son all now on earth can see what we are called to be: hope for a world in need, signs that love can succeed where true justice and peace endure."

This Sunday is the last of John's Gospels (five) which were sandwiched in between Mark's Gospels (Year B). These five Sundays emphasized the fact that Jesus is the Bread of Life. We are to be HOPE for a world in need. We are called to be what we eat: the Body of Christ. It doesn't stop at the exit of the church - that "exit" should be the entrance to share that Love of Jesus.

Our Prayer: Good and loving Father, help us to overcome all tendencies to show favoritism in our lives. Let us treat all persons as brothers and sisters in Christ and work and pray for their salvation. Inspire us, especially young men and women, to give ourselves to the work of Christ and His Church. Amen.

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: Faced with Jesus' claim to be the real bread from heaven, the truth, the revelation of the Father. his disciples had to make a decision. Today's Gospel reading gives their reaction to that claim. Many reject his words and refuse to believe that he "came down" from heaven. Jesus told them to "stop murmuring" and pointed out the need for that faith which only God can give. The Twelve remain with Jesus. They were the ones who would "remain with Jesus" once he ascended to the Father. Peter sums up their faith, accepting the revelation of Jesus with the words, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." The people who deserted him wanted answers they could understand. Their faith was weak. The apostles did not understand either, but because they loved Jesus, they believed and accepted without understanding. We, too, cannot really understand how Jesus is present in the Eucharist. We cannot know, intellectually, how bread and wine become his "body and blood." When we make our act of faith, however, we become one with him in a special, life-giving way.

Life Focus: Describe how your experience of the Eucharist has changed over the course of your life and how this has affected you. * Describe a struggle you had which led to a deeper faith. * Relate an experience that has shaken your faith. * Describe an experience when you have taken a risk without fully understanding the outcome. What effect did it have on your life?


Parish Directory
