From Deacon Don's Desk: We wonder why the Catholic Church survived for 2,000 years. St. Paul said "The weakness of God is stronger than men". St. John Chrysostom, bishop, had a homily that expressed the above. "In what way is it stronger?" It (the Church) made its way throughout the world and overcame all men, countless men sought to eradicate the very name of the Crucified Jesus, but that name flourished and grew ever mightier. It's enemies lost out and perished; the living who waged war on a dead man proved helpless. For the good deeds which tax-collectors and fishermen were able to accomplish by God's grace, the philosophers, rulers, the countless multitudes cannot even imagine. For how could otherwise 12 uneducated men who lived on lakes and rivers and wastelands get the idea for such an immense enterprise? How could men who perhaps had never been in a city think setting out to do battle with the whole world? In His (Jesus') lifetime He brought no nation under His banner, but by uttering His name we will win over the world? Would it not be wholly irrational to think such thoughts, much less to act upon them? It is evident, that if they had not seen Him risen and had proof of his power, they would not have risked so much. Are we ready to believe without seeing? We need to follow Simon Peter's reply: "Master, to whom shall we turn? You have the words of eternal life".

And wives, do not be discouraged by the 2nd reading to the Ephesians (5:21)-it should be taken as "be subordinate to ONE ANOTHER out of reverence for Christ". As Father Gleeson once said: "Marriage is a union between two good forgivers".

Our Prayer: Heavenly Father, through the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary, strengthen and protect your priests. May Your priests have the heart of St. Joseph, foster father of Your Son, to seek nothing but Your greater glory and salvation of souls. Amen.
