From the Pastor's Desk:

You never quite know where the Spirit of God is going to pop up. We believe that the church is guided by the Holy Spirit. The institution is infused with the Spirit, preserving it from error, even if members (and even leaders) of the

church go astray. We also believe that each baptized person is also endowed with the same Holy Spirit. This indwelling of the Spirit is one of the tenets of our faith.

Over time individuals, at the prompting of the Spirit, have called the institution back to its service of Christ. It could be someone like St. Catherine of Siena, or Dorothy Day or Blessed Pope John XXIII. Each in his or her own way acted in the grace of the Holy Spirit.

Maybe you won't be driving out demons (like the person in the Gospel), but the Spirit's gifts are given for the building up of God's people. What are you doing with yours?

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: There is a temptation in Church communities to control and possess all the ways God works and not give credit to anyone who is not of our kind. In today's Gospel the apostles forbid a man from casting out demons because he is not in their group of followers of Jesus. The same narrowness shows up in the first reading. Joshua complains that two Israelites are speaking for God with the power of God's spirit. They were not part of the seventy helpers at the special ceremony. Moses answers much like Jesus. The disciples are told they belong to Christ. The phrase is literally, "in the name of Christ." This name is powerful enough, not only to cast out demons, but to gather people into the person of Christ, Anvthing done for those who belong to Christ will be appreciated by God. Anything done to hurt or stand in the way of one who belongs to Christ deserves punishment. Any sacrifice is worth the effort to belong to Christ.

Life Focus: * Describe an experience in which a person was misjudged because he or she was not "one of us." * Relate an experience when God's power or love came to you through an unlikely person. * Name a time when your action became an obstacle to God's power working. * What do you need to cut out in order to be more fully alive?

From Deacon Don's Desk:

This past weekend was much more than I imagined. We are grateful to those who brought the Vatican Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition. You come to more fully realize how vital and real Eucharist is. There were about 120 miracles from many countries on display. "The flesh and

blood are human. The blood type belongs to the same AB category and was the same as that of the man of the Shroud of Turin. In 1973 further tests (500) were conducted under the World Health Organization's scientific commission to corroborate findings. Fifteen months later it was verified that the fragments taken from Lanciano in Italy (750 AD) were not likened to embalmed tissue. The commission declared the Flesh to be living tissue. In 1996 the commission of WHO and the UN declared that science has come to a halt, face to face with the impossibility of giving an explanation. The Flesh is still intact and the Blood is divided into five unequal parts which together have the same exact weight as each one does **separately**." Thanks to all who made the experience possible.

The guest book reflected over 500 visitors not including those who chose not to sign in. Eucharistic Adoration saw a steady stream of worshipers. "The Eucharist is the living Christ; as a living body is not without its blood, or living blood without a body, so Christ is received whole and entire under either form of bread or wine." (Council of Trent)

Our Prayer: Dear Lord, we pray Mary will guide Your priests to follow her words, "Do whatever He tells you." (Jn2:5) May Your priests have the heart of St. Joseph. May the Blessed Mother's pierced heart inspire them to embrace all who suffer at the foot of the cross and to always work for salvation of souls. Amen.




