From the Pastor's Desk:

Commandments are making their appearance in this year's readings. We hear some in this week's Gospel, and we'll hear some other ones (the Eight Beatitudes) on Sunday, November 1, when we celebrate the feast of All Saints.

What is clear from today's Gospel is that there is more to the Christian life than only following what we usually consider to be the commandments (the ten). The same was true for the pious Jew at the time of Jesus. The Ten Commandments were not the whole law. There was more to be done. Jesus would illumine that expectation for those who sought his wisdom. Beyond the commandments, there is the invitation to follow him. Living a Christian life is more demanding than observing the requirements of ten laws set down in different versions in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5. Ultimately, living as a Christian is following Jesus through death to life.

Scripture Focus: Today's Gospel illustrates the frequent conflict between wisdom and wealth. The man who asked the secret of everlasting life was clearly a thoroughly good person. But Jesus senses in this man an attitude of not needing anyone else. Jesus tells him, in effect, "All the resources on which you rely are useless. Get rid of them, trust in God, and follow me." <u>The challenge</u> here was not to *poverty* as such, but <u>to trust</u>. Salvation is God's gift, not a reward for human efforts.

Life Focus: * Relate an experience when you had to rely on someone other than yourself. How did this make you feel? * When have you abandoned something or someone you valued in order to better follow the gospel? * When have you worked too hard to earn respect or love? * What would you let go of right now to increase your trust in God?
