I was surprised and humbled by this award. It's an award not for my accomplishments but reflects the Christian effort that brought about this defining moment. I do not feel that I deserved to be in the company of such true winners. It's shared by those most deserving of this award.

Scripture Focus: Today Jesus predicts his suffering, rejection & resurrection for the third time. The pattern is always the same: Jesus predicts his suffering; the disciples fail to understand; Jesus then teaches clearly about himself & about what following him means. In his third prediction of suffering, Jesus describes how he will be handed over to his own people's religious leaders and to the Gentiles and will be spit upon and mocked. James and John, Jesus' inner circle of followers, get caught on the glory promised. They argue for first place. But Jesus points out to them that true greatness is serving the real needs of others - not what the masses of people or the ones in power want. Jesus is that obedient servant of God. **Life Focus:** * Speak of a time when you took the rap for someone else or when someone took the rap for you. * When has suffering in your life caused you to see things differently? * Describe an experience when you were required to do something you didn't want to do.
