From the Pastor's Desk:

When you only have a quarter, it's hard to believe that you're rich. Most of us don't have to rely on twenty-five cents alone. We have a credit or debit card, a checking account, or some resources that we can call on. Even in

these difficult economic times, using up our whole livelihood is not something that many of us confront. But there are people around us that have to make those choices, folks who have lost a job, incurred huge medical expenses, or are suddenly without a spouse because of death or divorce. For some the temptation may be that of the widow and her son in the first reading, "when we have eaten [what is left], we shall die." While Elijah worked a miracle, the Gospel today suggests that the miracle does not come from outside, but from within the community that knows those in need and reaches out.

(Based on today's Bible readings) Adult: How can faith free me to be generous? Child: What would I be willing to give up for someone else?

Teen: In what ways am I generous?

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: Today's reading from Kings illustrates several things: God's care for the poor, even the foreign poor (Zarephath was over Israel's border in what is now Lebanon); Elijah's activity as his agent; and, in the context of today's liturgy, the trusting generosity of a widow who sacrifices her own livelihood to the needs of another. Quite clearly we are invited to connect her to the widow of the Gospel reading. In Mark's Gospel the poor widow who contributed "all that she had to live on" is sharply contrasted with the wealthy who gave sizable amounts from their surplus wealth. The rich do not depend on God. They have plenty to live on. The widow now has only God and God's people to lean upon.

Life Focus: * By giving from her "want," the widow shows her trust in God. Can you recall an experience when you let go and put your trust in God? * *The scribes say long prayers and Jesus disapproves. How would you describe your prayer life and its development?* * From your experience, what are some practical ways you can contribute to the Church besides money? * *The widow in Israel's history stands for someone who has no support and is helpless. In what practical ways have you helped the helpless and disadvantaged in your community?* *Jesus criticizes the scribes for being religious in the wrong way. What are the qualities you find in a person you consider to be religious?

From Deacon Don's Desk:

Thank you Marianna, Virginia and Ann for your care in educating our Confirmation class. Last Sunday Tina and I had the privilege of doing a brief instruction to our confirmandi on altar serving. The few minutes did

not stress strongly enough the importance of this service. The word sanctuary means a holy place. To serve at the altar within the sanctuary is a great source of graces. Cardinal Griffen said, "To serve at the altar is next to the priesthood, the highest privilege which a human can enjoy. The Altar Server represents the faithful and takes an intimate part in the rich treasures of the church's liturgy. These ceremonies should be carried out with devotion, dignity and attention to detail." Altar servers must show the utmost respect and reverence through dress and behavior because they are privileged to walk into the sanctuary - a holy place. This means, listening attentively and in a state of prayer with hands in a prayerful position. They stand near the altar on which the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. They should humble themselves and bow each time they pass the altar of sacrifice: they are assisting at the Holy of Holies. (A minor tip: genuflect at the tabernacle, bow at the altar.) By showing reverence they are receiving blessings from God the Father of Jesus our Savior. Thank you for considering this awesome service.

Our Prayer: Heavenly Father, we ask Your blessings upon us and especially our altar servers, that they may serve at Your altar with reverence, attention, and love, and in so doing bring others to do the same. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.
