The Liturgical year is almost over and we start "Year C." Luke's gospel will be proclaimed beginning in Advent. But let's not leave "Year B" too hastily. The readings for Sunday give us the gift of HOPE. Daniel gives an "underground"

message to the Jews to not give up. Israel is occupied by Syrians and they try to impose the Greek language. The author writes in symbols (look for a deeper meaning) and indirect references. There is a direct correlation with the first reading to the Gospel. God is pointing to a brighter future for His faithful through Jesus. "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away." (Mk 13:32). Mark consoles us with this message of HOPE. "Build up your faith, hope and love and He will come."

November is the month of remembrance - keep our veterans in your prayers for through them we have the gift of peace and security. Thank you Nancy Miller and crew for our Memorial Mass.

Our Prayer: Lord God, make us humble of heart, help us to serve each other out of reverence for Your Son, Jesus. Pour out Your Spirit upon our priests, Your servants, that they may increase our faith and teach us to be examples of love for one another. We ask this in your Son's name. Amen.

Scripture Focus: As the Church year nears its end, the readings also speak of the end time. These readings were written during times of trial and persecution, and their purpose is to encourage people not to give up. Today's reading from Daniel comes just one hundred sixty-five years before Jesus. It speaks of great conflict - even the earth will shake and the stars will fall - but for the first time in the Old Testament, there is a very clear belief in the resurrection of the faithful and punishment for evil. God's kingdom will win over every kind of evil. God's faithful who do good and lead others to goodness (justice) will shine with God's own light. The Gospel proclaims that Jesus will come at the end of time to call his people from all over the world to share in his victory. All the physical world - earth, sun, moon, stars - will be under and belong to him. Life Focus: \* In tough times, what keeps you going? \* If the world were ending tomorrow, how would you experience today differently? What would you do differently? \* In what way do you need to persevere right now? \* How does your inner radiance reflect that of the Maker

\* How does your inner radiance reflect that of the Maker of the stars? \* How does Christian hope move beyond the expectation of reward in the afterlife? \* What in nature speaks most strongly to you of the ever-expanding love of God?
