

From Deacon Don's Desk:

Definition: Ten Commandments: The most important Top Ten list NOT given by David Letterman.

The message of Bethlehem is: "I want to introduce you to Jesus." Six years ago the B.C. comic strip had the caveman character writing a poem that goes like this: "How fitting we chose an evergreen tree, which symbolizes eternity, to celebrate the birth of He, who died on a tree, to save you and me."

As we get closer to that celebration of Christmas, let us reflect on it not as something that has happened, but as something that <u>is</u> happening. Jesus wants to be reborn in you, to be that radiant light, that reflection of His love to all, even those we find difficult to love.

Keep Christ in Christmas! Last year an article titled "Stop Marginalizing Christmas" in our local paper noted: New York City Mayor Bloomberg insisted the lighted tree outside city hall was not a Christmas tree, 'It's a holiday tree'! Which holiday Mr. Mayor? The Maplewood, N.J. school board banned all religious music from "holiday" concerts. Again, what holiday is this? The article continues, "Anti-Christmas forces say it's about diversity, protecting the sensitivities of Americans who get offended by the mere mention of the birth of Jesus. Who are these folks who find a baby in a manger so annoying it ruins their day?" President Grant, in 1870, made Christmas a federal holiday and according to surveys 90% of Americans celebrate it!!

He came to save you and me!

Our Prayer: Father, Your eternal Word took flesh on earth when the Virgin Mary placed her life at the service of Your plan. Lift our minds in watchful hope to hear the voice which announces His glory and open our minds to receive the Spirit who prepares us for His coming. Amen.

Scripture Focus: John the Baptizer was looking forward to and preparing for the coming of a great prophet, which was to signal the dawn of God's reign. His message was a stern, no-nonsense one: Repent or be damned! He also gives people specific examples of how they are to repent. People who have more than they need are to share with those who do not have enough. Tax collectors must stop cheating people. Soldiers and heads of state must stop intimidating people. The people who heard John wondered if he were the coming Messiah, but he quickly points to one "far superior to himself." The difference is indicated by their baptisms - one with water, one with the fire of the Holy Spirit.

Life Focus: * If you were to ask John the Baptist this same question today, "What am I to do then?" how would he answer you? * *How can we radiate to others the joy of God's presence within us*? * In our personal lives, how can we imitate John the Baptist as we proclaim the Good News? * *Reflect on a time when you believe God lifted a burden from you and "renew(ed) you in his love."* * Relate a time in your life when you felt discouraged, and it seemed there was little reason for celebration.
