From the Pastor's Desk:

The place of Jesus' baptism at Bethany across the Jordan has the remains of five churches, one built on top of another. In the early centuries of the Christian era those to be baptized walked down to an area where the

waters of the Jordan flowed through four pillars, dividing the water into a cross. Many of the newly baptized etched a cross into the stone of the baptistery walls, signifying their desire to be like Jesus. Indeed, in baptism we do become like Jesus. We become God's beloved sons and daughters who are called to manifest God's love to the world. Christ was shown to be the beloved Son by his love for others. If we want to follow him, we have to do more than wear a cross around our neck (or carve one into the baptistery wall). We have to manifest God's love.


