Is Your Family Prepared for a Natural Disaster? - News reports on the recent earthquake in Haiti have shown how easily families can become separated during the chaos of a natural disaster. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children offers the following recommendations to all families potentially impacted by a natural disaster. Know where your kids are at all times. Stay together. Take photos of your children with you when evacuated. Give children identification information to carry with them, including the child's name, date of birth, address, home number etc. E-mail digital photos of all family members to extended relatives and/or friends. Photocopy important documents and mail to a friend/ relative in a safe location. Make a plan with your children, so they know what to do if your family becomes separated during an evacuation. Catholic Schools Week


