
From the Pastor's Desk:

There's nothing like a couple of good temptations to get our minds wandering from God. Or, hopefully, to push us fleeing headlong into God's arms as we seek protection against evil. Temptation to sin is part of human existence,

and, since Jesus was fully human, he too was tempted. The temptations we hear about in today's Gospel take place as Jesus begins his public ministry. These were not the only temptations he faced in his life. At the end of Lent we will encounter the story of the agony in the Garden as part of the Passion narrative. Up until the very end, Jesus was tempted not to accomplish the Father's will.

We may fail during these forty days. We may not live up to our baptismal faith. But we have the tools to keep trying: prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and the community of faith. We are in this together.

From Deacon Don's Desk:

Lent is here. "Alleluia" is absent from the singing....until the Easter vigil. We fast during Lent to make room in our hearts and lives for God's love, which has to be present through charitable acts toward others. Someone said. "Faith that does not animate us to service is not faith at all. Works mean nothing if they do not inform or flow from our faith."

Our faith has to be like that plant whose roots go deep. A farmer plants corn and prays for a good rain so that the roots will go deep into the ground. That is so in a dry spell, it will survive. If it does not rain sufficiently, then the roots will stay close to the surface, and in a dry period it will wither and die; it will not survive. This Lenten period gives us the opportunity to "water" our faith so that it will not wither and die during times of trial and temptation. Lent will strengthen our relationship with God. Msgr. Kevin Kostelnik, the pastor of the Cathedral of Our lady of the Angels gave us a challenge for Lent:

#1 Pray five minutes each day. Find time for silent prayer (without interruption). "Dust off that pretty bible with gold lettering and pick a reading."

#2 Read about a saint each day. They are our real heroes, not AVATAR or Spiderman.

#3 Pray for the successor to be for our Archdiocese. #4 Pray for a just solution to the immigrant policy. #5 Most important, pick a partner and have them call and remind you each day to be sure you are following these Lenten challenges.

Our Prayer: Father, help us in this Lenten season to listen frequently to Your word, to celebrate more fervently a greater love for Christ, and may the Holy Spirit be our teacher, that we may encourage those in doubt and error to follow what is true and good. We make this prayer in Your Son's name. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The temptations of Jesus in the desert, as told by Luke, was not the first time Jesus was tempted, nor the last. But Luke, like Matthew, uses these three temptations in a powerful way to depict the frequent experiences of Jesus. He struggled with the difficult possibilities open to him in carrying out his mission right up to the agony in the garden. As a human being he was always free to choose his path. But Jesus was also conscious of his loyalty and relationship with God. Nothing will deter Jesus from establishing the Kingdom of God. His deepest trust is to follow God's plan and to carry out his mission according to that plan and none other. Jesus rejects Satan and places his trust in the quidance of God, no matter where that might lead.

Life Focus: * Describe a time when you asked for proof of God's care for you. * Recall an incident when you chose to accept or get out of an everyday hardship in your life. * Tell of a time when a temptation revealed something to you about God or yourself. * Relate an experience from your life when you wondered whether God card for you or not. * What besides "bread" satisfies the hungers in your life?


