

Sometimes we are the accuser, sometimes the sinner, sometimes the one who offers forgiveness. In the complexity of our lives, it is likely that we are all three at one and the same time.


In today's parable, Jesus invites us to see the relationship that binds people together, despite the fracturing caused by sin. It is tough to forgive; just ask the elder son. We're happy when God forgives us. Are we willing to be an occasion of such happiness for others?

From Deacon Don's Desk:



We know this Sunday's Gospel as "the Prodigal Son" but someone once said it should more aptly be called "the Merciful Father." Jesus directs the story to the Pharisees and scribes who complain that Jesus eats with tax collectors and

sinners. They complain as if their righteousness will buy them salvation. They keep laws out of "duty" not out of a sense of love. We should not do acts of charity to "buy" salvation but out of a sense of gratitude for the good things God has done for us.

Jill Penley may have adapted the following from the lessons of the parable of the Prodigal Son when she writes about when we meet God face to face:

God won't ask what kind of car you drove, but He'll ask how many people you drove who did not have transportation. God won't ask about the clothes in your closet, but He'll ask how many you helped to clothe. God won't ask how many friends you had, but He'll ask how many people to whom you were a friend. God won't ask in what neighborhood you lived, but He'll ask how you treated your neighbors. God won't ask about the color of your skin, but He'll ask about the content of your character.

Our Prayer: Heavenly Father, Your Son, Jesus Christ brought peace to a sinful world and mankind the gift of salvation by His suffering and death. Teach us, who bear His name, to follow the example He gave us; may our faith, hope and charity turn hatred to love, conflict to peace and death to eternal life. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The parable of the prodigal son is one of the best known of all the stories Jesus told. The parable is about divine mercy & the desire "to return to the father." Luke has in mind tax collectors and sinners who were "drawing near" to Jesus. The group of Pharisees and scribes, represented by the elder son, only complain and criticize. According to the way they see it, they have served God and obeyed the Law. They don't understand how sinners can also be sons and daughters of God. For Luke, the religious leaders who keep all the rules and think they can earn salvation by their own efforts are farther away from God than the sinners. **Life Focus:** * Which of these two sons is more like you? Reflect on an experience that would show this. * Was there a time when you were away from God? How did you find your way back? What brought you back? How did you feel? * How do you handle resentment in your own life experience? What words of advice to deal with resentment could you offer the older brother? * The father shows loving patience. Speak of an experience when you had to wait patiently. How did that make you feel? * Describe a situation when you found it difficult to ask for forgiveness. * Who would you have a difficult time letting back into the Church or the family? Why?
