The blessing is that God offers us mercy and forgiveness. This gift from God is something that we all want for ourselves. But almost like selfish children, we are sometimes less inclined to share God's mercy and forgiveness with others. The hardest part of sinfulness may not be the confession and turning back to God. After all God is always merciful. The most difficult part of sin may be turning toward others and forgiving them.

# From Deacon Don's Desk:

From last week's homily: In the old tradition two thirds of the inheritance goes to the eldest son and one third to the younger. So what's his beef? Envy, which leads to anger. He is blaming God for dealing him a bum hand!

We are past the halfway point in Lent. It's time to refocus our efforts or to have a metanoia, a 180 degree turnaround. Lent is a time for reconciliation, for asking forgiveness. We will have our parish Reconciliation service after the Lenten Retreat on March 25. If you are looking to go earlier, then check the schedule of Reconciliation services at neighboring parishes listed in the bulletin. In 1980 Pope John Paul II visited the North American College in Rome. The Vatican called ahead to say the Pope wants nothing more than soup and bread for lunch. Msgr. Murphy, the rector, recalls this as setting the example for the seminarians. During the meal the Pope said to the Msgr., "I have just come back from the States, and fasting and abstinence have collapsed. What happened to it?" Msgr. Murphy reflected, "Prayer, fasting and charity are the three pillars of Jewish and Christian piety; they are indispensable. You cannot say, 'I'm doing charity and hence do not have to fast.' The three pillars are incorporated in the Sermon on the Mount and the beatitudes. They are the heart of the Christian message."

Congratulations to scout Thomas Moler who received the Parvuli Dei (Children of God) award. The award helps the scout discover the presence of God in his daily life as a member of his family, parish and community.

**Our Prayer:** Merciful Father, forgive us for failing to see Christ in the poor, distressed, and troublesome. Help us to reverence Your Son in their persons. Give us the grace to be faithful to the Gospel and rise above our human weakness. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The Gospel story of the woman caught in adultery shows Jesus' concern for women put down and exploited. Those who accused the woman were using her to trap Jesus. If he says to let her go, he has no regard for the law that says she should be stoned. If he agrees that she should be stoned, he goes against his own gospel of compassion. Jesus says nothing; he stoops and scribbles in the sand. He says, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." The crowd, understandably, drifts away. Jesus is left alone with the woman. He treats her as a real person, with respect. He refuses to condemn her. He tells her to go, but from now on, to avoid this sin. Life Focus: \* Imagine this scene happening in your life. Who are you in this picture? How is Jesus guiding you toward forgiveness and compassion? \* In what way does having your sinfulness or faults exposed help you toward greater compassion? \* Recall a time when your mistakes were not held against you. \* What do you do to keep from judging others as less than yourself? \* Tell about a time when your first impression of someone was wrong.


