From the Pastor's Desk:

For the next few weeks we'll be reading from the Book of Revelation, the last book in the Bible. Popular preachers on radio and television have often used the symbolism in this book in ways not consistent with a Catholic

view of Scripture. Revelation is written in language that is described as "apocalyptic" - highly symbolic and somewhat obscure. What the church presents to us over the next few weeks are selections that remind us of the power of the risen Christ, that he conquers sin and death, and that he abides with us always. This is the ultimate message of the Bible's final words.

From Deacon Don's Desk:

The Resurrection is the central fact of human history. Our Lord has shown that humanity can conquer death. This is the most glorious event known to man. Of course, it is the highest point of the Church's liturgical cycle - everything

hinges on it. It is the ultimate proof that He IS God. Easter is the solemnity of solemnities.

A couple of things that come to light for me: John stresses Jesus appears even when the doors are locked which points to Jesus' physical appearance and, note, they were in hiding for fear of the Jews. Next week Jesus appears to the disciples a second time and they are STILL in hiding! They are slow to believe. When did they pass from fear to believing? There appears to be a gradual coming to believe. The point is, Jesus is relentless in leading us to believe in the resurrection. Belief is confidence, faith or trust. Trust leads to hope. Remember, "hope" is shorthand for the promise of our resurrection. Someone once said, "Believing in the resurrection is more than believing in a fact, it is trusting in Jesus."

I have a quiz for you: Which sacrament was instituted in this Sunday's Gospel?

Psalm 118 is placed at most Sunday's Morning Prayer (Liturgy of Hours). It's one of my favorites because my daughter came home from first grade 25 years ago and asked us to include it in the last line at grace before meals. She quoted the last sentence, "Give thanks to the Lord for He is good; He loves us always, thank you God!" We've been saying it for over 25 years. Thank you St. Joseph School.

Answer to quiz: Reconciliation.

Our Prayer: Jesus, my Redeemer, at each Mass let me thank You for the supreme sacrifice You offered to free me from sin. Help me to be sorry for my sins and to resolve to follow You more closely. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The appearance of Jesus that we hear about in today's Gospel involves more than a lack of understanding; it is a definite refusal to understand. Jesus agrees to Thomas' wishes concerning the wounds in his "hands" and sides." He commands Thomas to "touch" them. But sight is sufficient, and Thomas puts aside his demands. He hears only the final "command" of the Risen Jesus, to replace his unbelief with belief. John turns to those who "have not seen but who have believed." The things "written in this book" challenge those who never saw Jesus to believe.

Life Focus: * Thomas stands for all believers with reservations. Recall an experience that shows Thomas in you. * *Jesus' peace is a source of spirit, forgiveness and faith.* When did you last pray for forgiveness? * Describe a time in your life when it was difficult to feel the presence of Jesus in a time of need.
