I. While some of you may be reading this after attending the vigil Mass on Saturday night, most of you will see this Sunday morning. And so Jesus' words in the Gospel, "Come, have breakfast," are especially apropos. Jesus does

the same with bread and fish that he did with bread and wine: took and gave it to his disciples. This Eucharistic imagery reminds us that we encounter the risen Christ each time we do at the Mass what he did with his disciples. He took bread and wine and blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them, and they ate and drank.

Scripture Focus: This Sunday's Gospel is an introduction. The first part introduces us to the Gospel of Luke; the second introduces the Gospel message into the world. The first four verses of this passage form the prologue to Luke's Gospel. He writes not only to Theophilus (Beloved of God) but to the community of those who believe in Christ. The second introduction is like an inauguration speech by Jesus as he begins his work. Invited to give a talk on the scriptures, in his hometown synagogue, Jesus stands and reads from Isaiah. Anointed by the Spirit, he has been sent to preach the Good News to the poor, the disadvantaged, the exploited. A new age dawns and Isaiah's prophetic words are now fulfilled.

Life Focus: * From your experience, describe someone who is poor. * What is good news to a poor person? * Give an experience when you were blind to the needs of the poor. Give reasons for your blindness. * In the Gospel Jesus announces his work to bring God's kingdom. What is your work? * How would you introduce Christ and his teachings to someone who does not know him?
