From Deacon Don's Desk:



Here are a few "Did you knows:" The Catholic Church educates 2.6 million students everyday at the cost of \$10 billion, at a savings to taxpayers of \$18 billion. Ninety-two percent graduate to higher education. There are 230 colleges and

universities with 700,000 students, and 637 hospitals which account for hospital treatment of one of five people - not just Catholics - in the U.S. Written by Sam Miller, a Jewish businessman: With all press' vindictiveness in denigrating the Catholic Church he says, "They have blamed the disease of pedophilia on the Catholic Church, which is as irresponsible as blaming adultery on the institution of marriage." This is not only a Catholic problem. The church has taken major steps in curbing injustices to our children. He concludes, "Be proud to speak up for your faith with pride and reverence and learn what your Church does for ALL other religions. Be proud that you are a Catholic."
