From Deacon Don's Desk:



So what's the point, Dad? My daughter had missed the gist of my homily. Let me see if I can make sense for those who do not follow baseball! Oops, I mean the Gospel. The first reading in Acts of the Apostles tells of the apostles mak-

ing great strides among the gentiles. Then the Christian Jews said, Hey! They need to follow what we do - then the dissension/debate began. Holy Spirit intervened and they settled differences: avoid idolatry and incestuous marriage and follow some dietary practices. Throughout history it was not all "peaches and cream." The Church endured and survived many trials. "If anyone loves Me and keeps My word, My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him." Keeping Jesus' word is "Loving one another as He loves." Eliza Doolittle says to Prof. Higgins, "Don't talk about love - show me!" Spend a few minutes with God each day. Even a short while can help us reach out with an agape love (a doing love) that God wants us to share. As the tribal chief said to his successor, "You shall succeed me because you brought back the most precious gift, a vision of a better tomorrow." This is the vision Christians are called by Jesus to bring to the world. He tells us that the Holy Spirit will teach us everything and reminds us of what Jesus told us. His ascension into heaven is our commissioning to "build His church."
