From Deacon Don's Desk:

Tuesday morning, Fr. Michael Philen's homily really got me. After proclaiming Mark's Gospel (Mk: 10: 28-31) he said, "Salvation can't be earned. We already have it! But we are reminded that it can be lost! We have the gift of

salvation and we accept it by serving, not by being served. We need to serve Him in humility. He will bless and reward us in this life abundantly AND in the next." It reminded me of the little girl in church who saw the sun shining through the stained glass windows. She asked her father, "Daddy who are those people in the colored windows?" "Those are the saints, Sweetheart, people who lived for God and who loved Him very much." Two years later in religion class, the teacher asked, "Who are the saints?" No one raised their hand except the little girl. She slowly and humbly rose and the teacher asked again, "So, who ARE the saints?" "The saints are the ones the light shines through," the little girl replied. Saints are ordinary people like you and me. They made mistakes, they had temptations and annoyances like you and me. The difference is how they lived their lives. They understood humility. In the Scripture Focus, there is this question: "A life filled with lies hinders one from the truth. How do we recognize UNtruth? How do we keep open to the truth?"

Our Small Church Community ponders these and other questions while reflecting on the Sunday readings. Won't you think about joining us? How about letting us help you get started with your own group?

Our Prayer: Lord, we worship You, a Trinity of Persons, one eternal God. May our faith and the sacrament we receive bring us health of mind and body. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The Gospel reading emphasizes the work of the "Spirit of truth" in the Christian community. Jesus is about to leave his disciples & is making provision for their future. Even though he has more to tell them, they cannot understand it before the death/resurrection event. Only in the light of their experience of the risen Christ will they be able to comprehend its significance. This insight, given by "the Spirit of truth," will guide them throughout the centuries in their efforts to grow in understanding. A striking feature of this passage is its stress on the common working of Jesus, his Father and the Spirit of truth. They possess in common; they act in common. Life Focus: * Name a time when suffering and injustice inspired you to seek out the truth. * Any attempt to gain understanding of your enemy helps you not to condemn but to find peace in difficult situations. What do you do to try to understand your enemy? When has "understanding your enemy" led to acceptance?
