The Eucharist we share this day (every Sunday) is the sacrament of Christ's body & blood broken and poured out for us. As Paul reminds the Corinthians in the second reading, this tradition comes from the Lord who commands that we do this in remembrance of him. The Mass is more than a memorial service to the life & death of Jesus. What we celebrate each week is the real presence of Christ among us. He promised to be with us always. Through the Eucharist, he is. Our communion with him nourishes us until the day we join him at the heavenly banquet.



**From Deacon Don's Desk:**

As the Year of the Priest draws quickly to a close I found a quote that's worth repeating and for us to reflect upon: "Historically, there was only one sacrifice of Christ on the cross. Sacramentally, Jesus is sacrificed on the cross as often as the Eucharist is celebrated. Through the sacrament of Eucharist that we celebrate every day on our altars, we are mysteriously present at the death of the Lord. The ancient Jews would say on Passover night: 'In every generation let each of us see himself as one that came out of Egypt that night.' We Catholics say, 'We are present at the New Passover. We are present as the Lord gives His Body and Blood during the Mass. We are present under the cross with Mary and John. We are there whenever we celebrate the mystery of the Eucharist.'"

Please, as you begin your summer vacation, let it NOT be a vacation from that great Mystery, that Thanksgiving for all the graces He gives us. And all of this cannot be done without our priests who give of themselves at each Mass. Include them in your prayers.

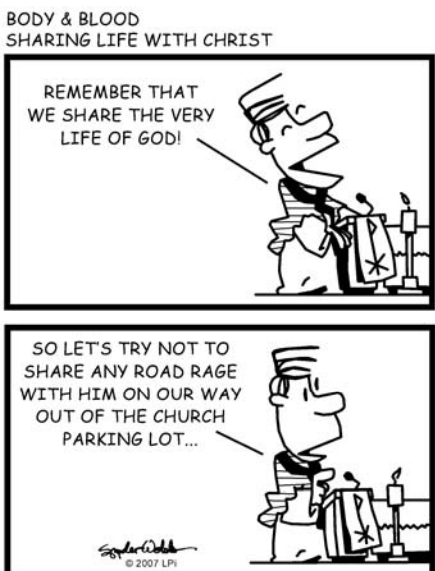
**Pope Benedict's Intention for June:**

**Centering Prayer**  
**June 15 & 29 - 7:00 pm - In the church**

**Small Church Community**  
**Scripture Focus:** Luke's Gospel stresses Jesus' table fellowship with people of all sorts. This and other themes emerge in his account of Jesus feeding the multitude. (1) When Jesus asks the apostles to give the people something to eat themselves, it is a thinly veiled hint that they are to imitate him in feeding the hungry. (2) His generosity is suggested by the fact that "they all ate until they had enough" and underscored by the quantity of leftovers, enough to fill twelve baskets. (Twelve symbolized all humanity.) Some people at Corinth had forgotten the significance of the Eucharist and were nullifying it by their selfishness. The rich members of the community were turning the common meal into a private bash. Paul reminded them that the Eucharist bonds us to all the people around God's table.  
**Life Focus:** \* When have you felt you were running on empty? \* *Do you hunger in your family, work or community? Name one thing you can do to make a difference.* \* What would make your life complete? \* *Christ related with all types of people. What type of people do you find easy to include in your life? What type of people are easy to exclude?* \* Today, who are the people who do not feel welcome in our Church? Can you take any practical steps to welcome at least one of these people?

Is overly compliant, passive, or withdrawn. Comes to school or other activities early, stays late, and does not want to go home.
