

From Deacon Don's Desk:



This Sunday's Gospel is all about **forgiveness** and I hasten to add **understanding**. Too often we tend to label people. We haven't "walked in the other man's moccasins for 30 moons" as the Indian saying goes. The Responsorial

Psalm (Ps 32) starts, "Lord, forgive the wrong I have done," words to keep in mind when putting a label on someone we really don't understand. In our Small Church Community we read and discuss the Sunday readings and what has moved or touched us. In the "So, what?" portion, we try to set the tone for the week that follows. Here are a few that resonated with me: "I will pray for all of our teachers that have our children in their care." "I will focus on **not** being critical of others." "I will focus on gratitude for our priests and all my blessings received."

John Wooden entered eternal life this past week. I love his quote, "If I were ever prosecuted for my religion, I truly hope there would be enough evidence to convict me." He also said, "Success is peace of mind which is a direct result of self-satisfaction in knowing you have made the effort to do your best to become the best that you are capable of becoming." That happens to be the Cub Scout Motto and a favorite saying of Matthew Kelly.

Our Prayer: God of goodness, teach us to appreciate the great gift that is the Mass. Scripture Focus: God's Kingdom often is the direct opposite of the world's ways. Today's Gospel shows how differently Jesus acts from what is expected. The Gospel contrasts a respectable man of religion, a Pharisee, with a woman who is a known sinner. The Pharisee keeps his distance from Jesus. The sinner comes close and, in a touching way, offers Jesus extravagant hospitality. Jesus, going against everything considered proper, lets himself be touched intimately and in public by a woman and a sinner. Jesus' story tells why: because her sins are forgiven, she shows great love.

Life Focus: * When have women taught you forgiveness? Love? * Describe things that we see in our community that reveal scorn for weak members. * Relate a situation in which your appreciation and gratitude for a person had to be expressed. * Who in your life has not held your past against you? * Share an experience when you were invited to begin to break the barriers of past hurts. What was your response?


