From Deacon Don's Desk:

Father's Day & many weddings occur in June, a special month. In our parish, many marriage milestones were celebrated. May these reinforce our deep faith in one another & continue with joy and peace in our married lives together in love. Fathers, you are the "salt of the earth." Keep in

mind, salt enhances the soup, i.e. the lives of your family. Father Kubicki, S.J. thought, "I'll take a survey after Mass as the people leave the church. I'll ask them, 'How was Mass today?' If they say 'good' I'll ask, 'Why?' Most will probably say Mass was good because of the length. 'It was under an hour,' or 'The homily was short, practical, & humorous,' or 'The music was nice,' or 'I felt a sense of community.' Now imagine Jesus standing outside church taking the survey asking, 'But what about Me? Did you remember Me? I told you to do this in remembrance of Me."

No Catholic who recognizes the Presence would leave the church in search of better preaching, better music, or a greater sense of community. Fr. Kubicki goes on to say. "Jesus is 'The Real Deal' and He's there at Mass and in the Blessed Sacrament, 'body and blood, soul and divinity.' Why settle for less?" Grab every opportunity you can to be united to Him in Holy Communion! After Communion spend a little time alone with Him.

Our Prayer: Father God, bless our family. Help us to be not only the first teachers of our children in ways of faith but the best teachers by bearing witness of Your love by what we say and do. Keep us in Your care this summer in our travels as we witness the grandeur You place before us. Amen.

Scripture Focus: Today's Gospel spells out what it means to follow Jesus, to be his disciples. James and John, "sons of thunder," angry at being rejected by the Samaritans, want to call down fire from heaven to consume Jesus' enemies. Jesus says there is no room for getting even in the Christian way of life. There is to be no violence. Luke develops the theme of discipleship further using three examples. Jesus tells the one who offers to follow him "wherever he goes" of the hardships involved. His strange reply to the man who wants to go home first to bury his father underlines the urgency to get on with proclaiming the reign of God. And finally there is a singleness of purpose involved in being a follower of Jesus. There can be no looking back to what one has left behind. **Life Focus:** * How do you react when someone criticizes you or is hostile to you? * When in your life have you been called to change direction (put your hand to a different "plow") because of your desire to be a follower of Jesus? * What does it mean to your everyday life to be a follower of Jesus? * What is your reaction to being called bv Jesus?


