From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

I visited a friend the other day at the hospital. She is a wonderful woman. A stroke has left her paralyzed and unable to talk. She is severely disabled. Her husband shared with me his memories of the beautiful young girl that he

married and all the years since then. He remembers his incessant need to work and to be productive, and how that took him away from his wife and his family. As he sits with her now he wishes he had more time to just be with her and to enjoy the love that they share.

Just like Martha in the gospel this weekend, sometimes it's easy to fall into the trap of being a producer or provider or a doer. It is far more difficult to simply just "be" and enjoy the sacredness of every moment. Without a doubt, we all need to work and to provide, but when we are defined by what we produce or make, then we wander far from the dream that God has for us. If our dignity was based on our productivity then God would have been smarter if he produced robots. Cherish those you love and remember that God loves us for who we are and not for what we produce or make. Our awareness of that gift allows us to just "be ourselves." When we cherish our loved ones and really value just being with them, it is then that we are also in God's presence. God asks nothing more from us than to love one another.

From Deacon Don's Desk:

A Jewish legal expert tests Jesus. Jesus demonstrates that love is superior to legalism. He goes so far as to identify the "neighbor" (a Samaritan who is the enemy of the Jew) as the "good guy." Now, we may not be in a position of

offering the depth of compassion that the Good Samaritan showed, but as Blessed Teresa of Calcutta often said, "Do little things with great love." How do we do that? Let someone else go ahead of you in line. Resist the urge to talk negatively about someone. Go an entire day without raising your voice in anger. Praise others when you notice their success. Show appreciation to waiters, receptionists and those who work in a service capacity. Cheer up someone who is having a bad day. Call someone who was absent from work or a gathering and tell them they were missed. Ask "how are you?" and really listen to the answer. Do a good deed for someone who can't repay you. Now you are on the way of the Samaritan.

Our Act of Faith: O my God, I firmly believe that You are One God in Three Divine Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit; I believe that your Divine Son became man and died for our sins, and that He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy Catholic Church teaches, because You have revealed them, who can neither deceive nor be deceived. Amen.

Scripture Focus: In today's first reading we get a glimpse of the importance of hospitality in the desert. The Gospel continues this theme of hospitality. Martha prepares the meal in the kitchen while Mary sits at the Lord's feet. Martha takes exception to Mary's action, but Mary is being hospitable in her own way. Jesus teaches Martha to balance her work with a bit of listening. It is not that her work isn't important, but action by itself can easily become mindless busyness. It's a question of balancing priorities. Notice that both women are close friends of Jesus and they are listed as doing the work of disciples.

Life Focus: * Who are you most like, Mary or Martha? Tell of an experience from your life to show this. How can you develop the other side of yourself? * Tell of an experience in your life when your attention was focused on the less important thing in a situation. * What are the contributions of women to your parish? * As an individual what do you do to prepare yourself to listen to Christ? Do you have a special time or place for listening? * Who, more than anyone, makes you feel at home? How? How can you show this kind of hospitality to others this week?



Did You Know? Child Abuse Data: Breaking Down the Numbers - Of the approximately 794,000 children found to be victims of child abuse or neglect in 2007, 59 percent suffered neglect, 10.8 percent were physically abused, 7.6 percent were sexually abused, 4.2 percent were emotionally or psychologically maltreated, and less than 1 percent were medically neglected. In addition, 13.1 percent of victims experienced "other" types of maltreatment such as "abandonment," "threats of harm to the child," and "congenital drug addiction." These maltreatment type percentages total more than 100 percent because children who were victims of more than one type of maltreatment were counted for each maltreatment.
