#### From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

What is a success? What is a successful life, a successful career, a successful relationship? Is a person's life successful if he or she is making a good salary?

There's a story about a grandmother who pulled out pictures of her three grandchildren, and showed them to a friend saying, "These are my grandchildren. This one's a rich doctor, this one's a rich lawyer and this one's the chairman of the board of a large corporation." The word success for her had to include having a high salary. But is real success predicated on salary? Sometimes that's the way a lot of people calculate success. But are they correct? Many times a faulty view of success is based on money, honors and titles. And this concept of success is a fallacy.

Success isn't predicated on what we have, what honors we receive, what jobs we hold, etc. Success is predicated on how each of us had developed as a person, how each one of us have become all that God created us to be.

St. Paul says in the second reading that our lives are hidden with Christ in God in such a way that when Christ appears, we appear. The personality of a Christina is so entwined with the person of Jesus Christ that Christ and the Christian must be one.

This is a different way of considering success. For the Christian, success isn't a present reality, it is a goal, the goal of our Christian life. We will reach this goal when every aspect of our lives reflect the Person of Jesus Christ that is success. All else is vanity.

#### From Deacon Don's Desk:

"Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" The first reading from the Book of Ecclesiastes leads us to believe life is an absurdity when in actuality the entire passage is a strong statement of what human life is without God! The

Responsorial Psalm 90 bolsters us with, "If today you hear His voice, harden not your hearts." The Gospel shows our weakness: that of greed, egotism, "keeping up with the Joneses." The rich man does not relate to others, and especially with God. He shows no gratitude for his bountiful harvest. Fr. Rolheiser a month ago talked about Morris West's autobiography. In it he mentioned that "gratitude wasn't easy to come by." West had many deep hurts, some of which were suffering abuse, rejection, not being valued. "It's no wonder that it is easier to be bitter than grateful, angry than gracious."

Rolheiser closes, "There is only one ultimate imperative in life: Before we die, we need to forgive. We need to forgive those who hurt us, to forgive ourselves for not being better than those who hurt us. To forgive life itself for some of the things dealt us and not least to forgive God for the fact that life is unfair, so as not to die with a bitter and angry heart."

**Our Prayer:** Father God, gifts without measure flow from Your goodness to bring us Your peace. Our life is Your gift. Guide our life's journey, for only Your love makes us whole. Keep us strong in Your love and teach us to recognize Your presence in all people especially in the poor and in those who mourn. We ask this in Your Son's name, Amen.
