From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

My hope and prayer for each of us is that inspired by Mary's complete acceptance of God into her life, and encouraged by the favor that God showed her, that we also are encouraged to give a complete yes to God again and again and again.

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: Even before the dawn of feminism and rising consciousness about the dignity of women, great women have done great things and history has been kind to their memory. We have, for example, Esther, Ruth and Judith from the Old Testament; pagan societies had goddesses as well as gods; Troy had Helen and France had Joan; Constantine had Helena and Augustine had Monica; Florence Nightingale, Dorothy Day, and Mother Teresa have all left their indelible marks. It is no surprise, then, that we also find a great woman remembered at the very heart of Christianity - Mary, the mother of our Lord.

This solemnity celebrates the "great things" God has done for Mary. God, who has "lifted up" his "lowly servant" Mary, lifts up all the lowly not only because they are faithful but because God is faithful to the promise of divine mercy. Mary's assumption of body and soul into heaven celebrates the mercy of God and the promise to us of a share in that same mercy. It is God who does great things because God has promised mercy. The great thing Mary does is say yes to being an instrument of God's promise. The great thing God does for us is invite us to share in that same promise - everlasting life.

Catechetical Corner

Our body postures are full of meaning and say a lot about what is happening at Mass. When we sit, we sit to listen; and when we stand, we



stand to praise; and when we kneel, we kneel as a sign of sacred moments or special prayers. Our postures are acts of prayer, prayers of the heart and body.

The GIRM (The General Instruction of the Roman Missal) states that the faithful stand for the Eucharistic Prayer, kneeling at the end of the "Holy, Holy, Holy Lord" until the "Great Amen," unless health, lack of space, or some other good reason suggests remaining standing.

Until the 12th century, everyone stood and held both hands in the prayer position like the priest does today - the posture of offering one's self. For the last 800 years we have kneeled in the Roman Catholic Rite. After Vatican II, some pastors began asking the people to stand for the whole Eucharistic prayer. They did this because Vatican II teaches that "the full conscious and active participation of all the faithful in the Mass" was the aim to be considered before all else.

Some pastors felt that while kneeling down, people were watching and adoring Jesus, but not always participating fully and entering deeply into the mystery of the Eucharist. Some priests feel that full participation in the sacrament can count as the "some other good reason" to stand of which the law speaks. As you can see there are differing viewpoints on whether we should kneel or stand.

All of our parishes in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and most Dioceses throughout the U.S. are asked to kneel as requested by the GIRM. One of the characteristics of our Church is that we are all in communion with one another under the guidance of our bishops in communion with the Bishop of Rome. It is in that spirit of communion with the other parishes in our Archdiocese and in that spirit of communion with the Universal Church that we follow the instructions of the GIRM and kneel at the consecration of the Mass, always remembering that those who are unable to kneel may feel free to sit.

Did You Know? The prevalence of abuse in society -

In surveys of adults, one out of five women and one out of 10 men reported that they were sexually molested before they were 18 years old. This means that an estimated 40 million adult survivors of child sexual abuse are living in the United States today. An estimated 9.6 percent of all school children will be molested by an educator or an employee of a school between kindergarten and 12th grade. Between 13 and 34 percent of all females will be victims of sexual assault before the age of 18, and 7 to 16 percent of all males will also be victimized before they are 18.
