From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus is astonished to find people at a banquet scrambling to get the places of honor at the table. They want to be perceived as important based on where they sit down at an event. They want this recognition

in order to feel good about themselves.

Jesus urges them to take a different path. He suggests that they take the least important seat - to allow the host to move them up to a position of importance if that is what the host desires. Then if they are honored, it will be genuine.

"My child," we're told in today's first reading, "conduct your affairs with humility and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts." Humility is how we are to approach our lives. Humility means not insisting that our way is best. Humility means keeping an open mind about other options. Humility means putting ourselves in a position where God can provide for us as God wills. What will we find if we practice humility? Love. More love than we can possibly fathom.

Last year I went on a hike in the mountains with my nephew and his two sons. It was supposed to take two hours. It took almost four hours. We took a wrong turn and ended up on a much longer trail than we had planned to take. My nephew's boys thought we were lost, which they thought was a great adventure.

The boys pretended to be lost and scared. Then they pretended to be rescued. They laughed and played. When we finally ended up back where we had made the wrong turn, we laughed even more. "We took the wrong turn, Daddy," my nephew's son said, "and I'm glad. It was fun." I agreed with them. It was far better than our original plan.

God is everywhere, asking us to open ourselves up to his love. If we can find the humility to accept God's direction rather than insist that our own plans are correct, we just might find that life is more fun.

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: The setting for today's Gospel passage is another meal. This setting provides the material for Jesus' teaching. The lessons from both parables look to what should be done in order to be at the heavenly banquet in the Father's house. We must be willing to accept our strengths and weaknesses. The weaknesses are the way we come to depend on God and one another. Those who are truly humble will also be willing to come to the aid of the poor because they know that they, too, are poor. This parable prepares us for eternal happiness, as opposed to immediate self-gratification and repayment for favors done.

Life Focus: * Recall a situation when you put someone else first and when someone put you first. * Relate an experience when you felt obligated to pay back a gesture of goodwill. What was the outcome? * How can you practice giving yourself or your possessions without expecting anything in return? * How do you deal with the "beggars, crippled, lame and blind" in this world? Who are they for you?

Catechetical Corner

Have you ever been to Communion and when you returned to your pew were confused as to whether you should be standing or sitting or kneel-



ing? You look around and see your fellow parishioners doing all three. Out of respect for those who are still standing, you decide to stand. Then all of a sudden, everyone who was standing takes their seats as if on cue. What happened that they all sat down together? Did the priest just sit down? Or did the communion hosts just get put back in the tabernacle? If you've ever had this thought, you're not alone. This happens in many parishes. So what is the right posture during Communion? Should we sit?...or kneel?...or stand?

The GIRM (General Instruction on the Roman Missal) tells us that, "The uniformity in standing, kneeling, or sitting to be observed by all taking part is a sign of the community and the unity of the assembly." Then it goes on to say, "For the sake of uniformity in movement and posture, the people should follow the directions given during the celebration by the deacon, the priest, or another minister." GIRM #20-21 In other words, we can usually look to the priest as our role model for what posture we should assume. If we look closely at the priest, what we are likely to see is that he will sit down as soon as everyone has received communion.

In describing his vision for Eucharistic liturgy in *Gather Faithfully Together*, Cardinal Mahony wrote, "Sunday's single Communion song continues until presider and assembly sit down after all have taken Holy Communion." What better sign of the unity of the assembly than to stand in solidarity as all partake from the Lord's table? After all have communicated is the appropriate time to sit down (or kneel) and reflect in silence on the profound meaning of what we have just received.

We come to taste the presence of Him we claim as Lord, His dying and His living, His leading and His giving, His love in cup outpoured. The feast is spread before us. You bid us come and dine, in blessing we'll uncover, in sharing we'll discover Your substance and Your sign.

Words we can meditate on and help us re-discover the Eucharist, our source and summit of our lives.

May the Eucharist, the taste of heaven's justice, give us renewed courage to think beyond our self interest, even our national interest and reach out to those in need as was the plea at last Sunday's Mass for relief in Tanzania. Remember, God is never outdone in generosity.

Our Prayer: Heavenly Father, You have given us the mother of Your Son to be our queen and mother. With the support of her prayers may we come to share the glory of Your children in heaven. We ask this through Jesus Christ, Your Son who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen.




