From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

In today's Gospel reading Jesus tells his disciples "whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." This doesn't seem like the greatest of invitations. I mean, how many of us want to carry a cross like

Jesus did? It is a journey of sacrifice and suffering.

Sometimes we have a hard time conceiving of how God wants to fulfill our deepest desires, and we may just have to be open to the fact that maybe the way of the cross is not a way to endless suffering but the way to endless joy.

The problem is, if we cannot "know God's counsel," as the Book of Wisdom tells us today, then how can we experience the infinite joy that God offers?

Maybe we need to use our imaginations so that we will be satisfied with nothing less than infinite joy. Why settle for mere success and financial security when the redemption of the cross is offered to us?

Jesus calls us to dream big - to dare to imagine that we can follow him and find a happiness that transcends all pain and suffering. If we follow Jesus, and even if we don't, we will still experience hardship and difficulty. The good news of the Gospel is that we will carry heavy burdens and heavy hearts much easier if we dare to love others as Christ loves us.

Catechetical Corner

Do you know the difference between a "homily" and a "sermon"? Did you even know there is a difference?



When I put the question to my

nieces and nephews, one said "I know the difference: a homily is shorter!" Another tried a more serious answer: "Catholics do homilies, while Protestants do sermons."

We may want to use the terms interchangeably; but there are nuances that make them different. "Homily" is rooted in the Greek "homlietikos" which means "conversation", while "sermon" comes from the Latin "sermo" or "speech".

Some people think of a sermon as a kind of annoying lecture (you know, the "hellfire and brimstone" kind of thing). In reality a sermon is a lecture type of teaching. A sermon, while it may be a holy speech, doesn't need to have any connection to the Scriptures at all, but usually calls us to consider certain topics and calls us to take action or to adhere to a teaching or principle.

Some people like speeches, but I love a good conversation. A good homily feels like a conversation, a breaking open of God's Word and how we apply it to the concrete situations in our lives. Hopefully we listen to the priest or deacon, and then continue the conversation in our mind, responding with how God's Word is alive in our lives. The homily attempts to do what the Scriptures themselves do: proclaim the wonderful things that God has done and continues to do for us.

While background checks and fingerprinting of all those who work with children in the Archdiocese of L.A. are important, they are used in conjunction with abuse awareness and prevention training programs to help ensure the safest possible parish and school environments for our children. An archdiocesan background-tracking information system, Volunteer and Personnel Information Network (VPIN), tracks assignment histories and compliance by employees and volunteers of fingerprinting, background checks and mandatory VIR-TUS sexual abuse prevention training. VPIN allows parishes and schools to adapt features of the system to fit their local needs and it assists the archdiocese to complete its audit reports.
