From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

In the gospel today we hear about two men in the Temple, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee was filled with self-deception and self-conceit. His self-deception was built on comparing himself with the other man in the Tem-

ple who was a tax collector. Comparing ourselves with others can be self-deceiving and is a form of avoidance and denial. When we're totally concerned with other people's faults then we're not paying attention to our own. The tax collector probably didn't even notice the Pharisee. He was simply paying attention to the state of his own soul and the fact that he needed God's forgiveness.

Hopefully, our Church is all about forgiveness, about God's tender and loving mercies. Sure, we've all sinned. Who hasn't? But it's what we do about sin that matters. In our relationship with God each one of us has been gifted with God's love, a love that flows through our family of faith, the Church. We are all God's children. Yet God sees us and loves us individually. He doesn't judge us as better or worse than another person. He gives all of His love to each one of us.



head: "It's impossible for the Church to remain on its feet if it doesn't get on its knees." The real joy was playing with the likes of Eric and Tom. These two kept us a little under par. Even my son, Greg, is starting to out hit me!! Humility reigns. The fellowship was awesome. The Knights again flexed their **charity**. There's one word that keeps bugging me: why do they call a golf game a "classic." Webster's says: classic means traditional, enduring, first rank, highest class. Synonym: quintessential, textbook. 

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: God is attentive to the prayers of those who have no one else to turn to. These outcasts of society realize that God is their only hope and so, when they pray, they really *pray*. Their prayer comes truly from the heart that acknowledges God's goodness and kindness. The prayer of the tax collector in the Gospel is an example of such prayer. The tax collector simply asks God's mercy for his sinfulness. Jesus heartily approves this form of prayer, the prayer of the lowly which "pierces the clouds." The Pharisee is trapped in this own self-righteousness toward prayer, toward God, toward his fellow Jews and toward himself.

Life Focus: * When do you identify with characteristics of the Pharisee? When do you identify with characteristics of the tax collector? * *Relate an experience when you reached out to someone very different from you.*

- * When has a simple person, perhaps an outcast, been able to teach you something important? * Where are you working too hard at something? Where aren't you working hard enough? What will you do about that soon? * When have you done the right things for the wrong reasons?
- * Recall an experience when admitting a wrong was one of the best things you ever did.
