From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

In many soap operas we see an interesting take on marriage. Sometimes a character loves one person but marries someone else because of pressures, convenience or deceit. Who is the true spouse? It is similar to the question asked in the

Gospel today.

According to the customs and laws that existed at the time of Jesus, if a woman became a widow, her husband's brother was obligated to marry her so that she wouldn't end up being destitute. In the end, who would be her true spouse?

In our culture we always say that family is important and that we value family above all else. But, when we watch the soap operas or hear the statistics, we see that the concept of marriage as something sacred is gradually being lost.

In the soap operas it seems almost normal to have all these problems and of course there is an easy fix. If things don't work out in the soaps we're encouraged to divorce or separate and find someone new. Sometimes things may not work out, and marriages were not entered into consciously and freely and as such they are not life giving.

Our God is a God of the living. Marriage should be life giving. Marriages that are not based on truth, or only exist for convenience, aren't life giving and are not in accord with God's command to love one another.

Our calling today is to seek the things that give us life and to reject those things that aren't life giving. Who will be the true spouse in the other life? Jesus says, don't worry about those things for now. My hope is that we are concerned with being life giving in our relationships today and enjoy these relationships in the here and now.

As we prepare for the new liturgical year, we will be meeting with the various ministries. We recently finished meeting with all of our lectors. Catechetical Corner

Many of you are familiar with seeing the deacon assisting at Mass. The deacon's ministry during the Mass is very



important. The deacon proclaims the Gospel at Mass. He also has the faulty to preach the homily. He instructs the people and leads them in prayer and reads the petitions. He prepares the altar at the time of the Offertory and he also prepares the Cup.

During the Mass you are familiar with seeing the deacon standing slightly behind and at the priest's right side. This is the way in which deacons have served at the altar in our Archdiocese for many years. In other dioceses throughout the United States the deacon has served in the same way, with one exception.

In other dioceses the deacons kneel from the beginning of the epiclesis, (the time when the priest extends his hands over the gifts and makes the sign of the cross over them) until the priest elevates the chalice for the people to see. This is the normal posture for the deacon according to the GIRM (General Instruction of the Roman Missal).

Cardinal Mahony and our new coadjutor Archbishop Gomez have asked our deacons to comply with these specific instructions regarding the deacons found in the GIRM beginning November 1. Beginning this week the deacons in our Archdiocese will kneel at the appropriate time. There are exceptions to this rule. If a deacon has knee problems or has trouble kneeling, then he is exempt from these instructions. Nothing changes for the congregation who will continue to kneel in the usual manner during the consecration.

Scripture Focus: In this passage we find Jesus teaching in the temple. The Sadducees, who believed in the absolute authority of the law, approached Jesus with a question about the law. These Sadducees belonged to a group who did not accept the Jewish tradition that believed in the resurrection of the dead. They objected to those who believed that any afterlife was merely a continuation of earthly life. None of us know exactly what to expect after death, but we do have the promise of eternal life and we believe in the fullness of that life.

Life Focus: * How do you feel about meeting your spouse, mother or father after you all have died? * Tell of a time you tried to convince a person of something you believed, but he or she did not. Were you successful? Why or why not? * Tell of your first experience with death. * Write down three things that you believe about life after death. What is the strongest feeling you have about these?

From Deacon Don's Desk:

The liturgical year is almost at an end. November 1 was the feast of all Saints. When it falls on Saturday or Monday, L.A. Archdiocese abrogates (officially annuls) this holyday of obligation. On November 2, many attended All Souls

Cemetery on that feast day. St. Luke will be with us for the next three Sundays, then Advent begins Year A on November 28.

This Sunday Luke has Jesus tested by some Sadducees with a ridiculous scenario, trying to deride Him regarding the resurrection and life eternal. God is not a God of the dead but of the living. God cares for you! Benjamin Franklin wrote this inscription for his gravestone: "The body of B. Franklin, printer; like the cover of an old book, its contents worn out and script of the lettering and gilding lies here, food for worms. But the work shall not be wholly lost, for it will, as he believed, appear once more in a new and more perfect edition, corrected and amended by the Author." Ben's words refer to a "new creation" which Jesus began and He wants our help to bring it to completion. How are we doing in this regard? How are we strengthening our relationship with God? St. Augustine says, "Before God can do 'His thing,' we must do 'our thing."

Our Prayer: Lord, thank You for the nourishment You give us at Eucharist, it is our food for everlasting life. Help us to live by Your Gospel and so bring us to Your kingdom. Amen.


