From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Why does the second reading tell us today that we need to wake up? What kind of sleep is God talking about? Sometimes people appear to be sleeping when it comes to their relationships with others. They can pass people by, never realizing

what a person needs. And sometimes even when they see the needs of others within their community they prefer to let others do all the work.

At times it is easier to keep on dreaming and not be aware of the things that are happening around us, so we remain asleep and we don't take any action.

The time of Advent is here. It is a time of waiting and being alert. Unfortunately in our society this time of waiting and preparation can be synonymous with shopping and frenzied activities that lulls us into a sleep that stops us from being alert. What is really important is to remain awake and to see what's going on around us and to pay attention to the people that are close to us and to recognize their needs.

In falling asleep we could miss out on the greatest thing that could happen to us: the opportunity to have a real and personal encounter with the God who made us and loves us. Remember, it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep.

Did You Know? Always Keep an Up-to-Date Photo of Your Child - Picture this: A good photo could save a child's life. One of the most importent tools for law enforcement in the case of a missing child is an up-to-date (take a new one every six months), good-quality photograph. The photograph should be a recent head-andshoulders color photograph of the child in which the face is clearly seen. It should be of school-portrait quality, and the background should be plain or solid so it does not distract from the subject. When possible, the photograph should be in a digitized form and available on a compact disk (CD), as opposed to just a hard copy. This minimizes the time necessary to scan, resize, and make color corrections before disseminating it to law enforcement. The photograph should have space for accurate, narrative description useful to identify the child, such as name, nickname, height, weight, sex, age, eye color, identifying marks, glasses, and braces.
