From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

With a New Year approaching, we often begin it by making new resolutions. Some are a bit funny and can be difficult to keep, such as losing weight or exercising. Those are two biggies that I'm dealing with this year. Sometimes, resolutions aren't kept for very long.

St. Paul shares with us today some wisdom that would be a wonderful New Year's resolution for everyone. Today on this feast of the Holy Family, we are reminded that we all want to have good and solid relationships in our families. St. Paul's words of wisdom show us the way. He shares with us the virtues that help us foster the bond of love. He tells us that we can strengthen this bond of love by employing the virtues of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience.

Today we celebrate the day of the Holy Family and are called to the life of a new family where relationships are not based on who can do more, or on the envy between siblings or on unequal treatment, but on compassion, kindness, and patience.

My hope for all of us is that at least one of our New Year's resolutions asks us to live the virtues that St. Paul shares with us today, and in keeping this resolution we know that we become more like the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

From Deacon Don's Desk:



Before this year slips away I want to say, 'Altar Servers, thank you!!" You have enhanced the Mass immeasurably. Your presence has given us a "Liturgy with style and grace." The test of a good altar server is that they are

not noticed (except by their parents!) They know their part and move about effortlessly. Timing is important as well. When the deacon needs water, you are there; when the Sacramentary is needed by the presider, you are there; when the ciborium is cleansed, you are there to take it and place it on the credence table. Thanks also go to Ann Crowley, the first of instructors, and Father Jim for his concern, instruction and guidance so that our liturgy is truly enhanced. One request on the behalf of this lowly deacon, you don't have to be a fifth through eighth grader to be an altar server. Are there any adults that would be interested in serving at the altar? All servants must serve with devotion and dignity and be attentive to detail.

A couple of weeks ago (Dec. 12) a question in the Gospel popped out at me: "What did you come out to see?" It became clear to me that when the priest raises the Bread broken over the raised Chalice and begins: "Behold the Lamb of God..." this is what we came to see. It should be clear to all that we come to believe and see Jesus and partake. He wants us to be transformed and as we are sent, to be that same Jesus when we go out into the world. "Jesus immerses Himself totally into our humanity thereby transforming us to be saved by His suffering death and resurrection." ... St. Augustine

Our Prayer: Father, help us to live as the Holy Family, united in respect and love. Teach us the sanctity of human love and show us the value of family life and help us to live in peace with all men so as to bring us to the joy and peace of Your eternal home. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.
