From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Isn't it astonishing that the three "Magi" from the east recognize and worship Jesus before anyone else does?

I mean, these aren't only foreigners, but they are priests for different religions. Yet they recognize

the signs of the times, and acknowledge the birth of the "King of the Jews" long before any of the religious leaders of Israel even notice him. It would be like the Dali Llama announcing that the Second Coming of Christ was taking place. Would we trust his insight? Today's celebration suggests that we should.

Epiphany teaches us that God speaks to and through all peoples, regardless of their race or creed. The Magi go to great lengths to pay respect to Jesus, traveling a great distance and bringing him costly gifts. They have earned their place in history as people of faith, who followed the truth even though it led them away from home, and away from the religion of their culture.

God can work through astrologers. God can work through earthly kings. God can work through the stars in the sky. God can and will speak to us at any time, through any person, event or encounter. Maybe God is speaking to us now through a co-worker, a friend, a family member.

We're called to be prepared to recognize and worship God in any circumstance. That is the miracle of the Christmas season --- the love of God can come to us in a form that we would never expect. In the Gospel today, God comes to us through a baby, a migrant family, and a group of holy foreigners.

My hope and prayer for each of us at the beginning of this New Year is that we understand more fully that there are no limitations on how God can work in our world.

From Deacon Don's Desk:



Recently we visited another parish and noticed their magi rode a camel and an elephant. I had never seen that before. On reflecting, we seem to place too much importance on how many, what they rode, etc. We miss the point, for me

anyway, that magi represented the Gentiles who were first to adore Jesus. But the full thrust of this Epiphany is that God is with us! He is for the whole world, Jew and Gentile. The magi went back to their homeland and shared their joy. The Responsorial, Psalm 72, is a prayer for the King. It praises Him. Part of that Psalm reads, "May all the kings bow before Him, all nations serve Him. For He rescues the poor when they cry out, the oppressed who have no one to help." It's a good reflection.

Heard of the "Advent Virus?" Warning: you must be alert to symptoms of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Some of the signs are: 1) An unmistakable ability to enjoy each moment. 2) Loss of interest in judging others. 3) Loss of interest in interpreting actions of others. 4) Frequent, overwhelming episodes of appreciation. 5) Frequent attacks of smiling. 6) An increased susceptibility to the love extended by others as well as uncontrollable urge to extend it. This virus can and has affected many. Some systems have been completely cleaned out because of it. This Advent Virus could pose a threat to what has been a fairly stable condition of conflict in the world.

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: Epiphany means "manifestation," a revelation of Jesus as truly God. Matthew and Luke show this child to be divine through stories of "signs and wonders" when Jesus was an infant. Matthew's account of the visit of the three magi also shows the Church's mission to the Gentiles. Matthew's audience, largely Jewish Christians, was struggling to accept the presence of Gentile Christians in their community. Matthew shows in this Gospel passage that the salvation of Gentiles as well as Jews was indeed God's plan.

Life Focus: * What helps you stay focused on God's presence in everyday situations where God is usually not mentioned? * When have you come to appreciate people you used to pass by or not notice? * Who and what on your journey has helped you to know and understand Jesus and his message better? * How do we reconcile the material gifts we have in our lives with the simple life-style of Jesus? * Describe an experience in which you felt Jesus' presence during this Christmas season. * Relate an experience in which God has been shown to you. * Recall an experience of God coming to you in an unexpected way or person. * Tell of a time when you anticipated something wonderful was about to happen, but other people were negative. * Who helps you see God? Who or what makes believing more difficult?

Did You Know? Shopping mall safety tips - It is easy for kids to get sidetracked with all the sights, sounds, and smells surrounding us at holiday time. It is especially important to monitor your children when taking them through the mall during the Christmas season. If children become separated from you, tell them to look for a "safe stranger" who can help them. For example, a mom with kids or the cash register person can help a child who is lost. Avoid telling children to go to the "manager." Any adult in a suit, who looks important, can look like the manager to a child. Children must be told never to leave the mall or store to go looking for you in the parking lot.
