From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

With today's celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord, we conclude the holy season of Christmas. Today's feast is considered the "second manifestation" of our Lord Jesus Christ. The first, which is the Epiphany of our Lord, was celebrated last Sunday.

The Baptism of the Lord has historically been associated with the celebration of Epiphany. Even today, the feast of Theophany, celebrated on January 6 by the Orthodox Church, is the equivalent to the Roman Catholic Feast of the Epiphany. It focuses primarily on the Baptism of the Lord as the revelation of God to humanity.

Why do we remember the Baptism of Jesus? The Church wants to stress through this liturgical feast the importance and significance of baptism in our Christian lives.

Through baptism, we not only become formal members of the Church, but we also are given a mission to proclaim the Good News of Salvation to all. That is why many theologians today regard baptism as a sacrament of commissioning, that is, through this sacrament, we are being sent to the world to announce the good news of the Gospel.

It is precisely because of this that Jesus wanted to be baptized by John the Baptist. He did not need cleansing. He simply wanted us to realize that like Him, we, too, are called to evangelize. This is our baptismal calling.

As we remember today Jesus' Baptism in the River Jordan, we call to mind our own baptism. We, too, have been called to proclaim the Good News of Salvation. My hope and prayer for each of us is that we will be faithful to that mission.

Catechetical Corner

At first glance, the Baptism of the Lord might seem an odd feast. Since the Church teaches that the Sacrament of Baptism is necessary for the remis-



sion of sins, particularly Original Sin, why was Christ baptized? After all, He was born without Original Sin, and He lived His entire life without sinning. Therefore, He had no need of the sacrament, as we do.

In submitting himself to the baptism of St. John the Baptist, however, Christ provided the example for the rest of us. If even He should be baptized, even though He had no need of it, how much more should the rest of us be thankful for this sacrament that frees us from sin and initiates us into the Church! His Baptism, therefore, was necessary--not for Him,

Many of the Fathers of the Church, as well as the medieval Scholastics, saw Christ's Baptism as the institution of the sacrament as well as the revelation of the Trinity.

The Fathers of the Church said that His flesh blessed the water, and that the descent of the Holy Spirit, in the form of a dove, and the voice of God the Father announcing that Jesus was his Son, announces that our God is trinity of per-

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: Our first reading is one of the four "Servant Songs" in the Book of Isaiah. The "servant" is both an individual and someone who stands for all the people. The servant will triumph - but only after suffering. When Jesus comes to be baptized, John is confused. But Jesus reveals the Father to John and declares himself to be the "son" who alone knows God's will. When Jesus comes from the water, the Spirit comes in visible form. Jesus is revealed as "servant," "beloved," "chosen one" with whom God was "well pleased."

Life Focus: * Give examples when you expected to be the receiver but turned out to be the giver. * Describe a time when you experienced God working through you in a way you had not expected. * Identify a way your understanding and appreciation of God evolved throughout your life. * Who has been willing to suffer for you? What has been the effect on you? * When have you found some peace even in time of turmoil and suffering?

- * Describe an experience when you knew you were loved. Who has helped you believe your life was worthwhile?
- * Relate an incident when you felt God's love. * Describe a time you were asked to do something you weren't ready to do.

Along with "cleaning" out our shelves and closets (and the deacon's garage), we need to take a look at our spiritual lives to "refresh," as our computer button says, not "escape" or "delete."

I'm sure that resolutions abound but one that should be put on your list is attending **Eucharistic Adoration**.

Our Christmas "Preface" says, "You fill our hearts with joy as we recognize in Christ the revelation of Your love. No eye can see His glory as our God, yet now He is seen as one like us. Christ is Your Son before all ages, yet now He is born in time. He has come to lift up all things to Himself to restore unity to creation and to lead us from exile into his heavenly kingdom."
