If we have Hunger of the spirit we will seek nourishment and strength in God's word and Spirit.

If we have Sorrow about our sins and we mourn over wasting our life, then we will be led to freedom from guilt and spiritual oppression.

If we are humble of heart then God is revealed to us as the true source of abundant life and happiness. Jesus' beatitudes confront us and tell us to make decisive choices concerning the life we live here on earth.

My hope and prayer for each of us is that we come to a fuller understanding in our hearts that God meets us in our weakness, in our sadness, in our hunger for salvation and in our attempts to do what is just and right.

We (Catholic schools) are responding to a tremendous need by ensuring that the students who attend our academically rigorous and faith-filled schools are best prepared to thrive in high school, college and beyond so they grow up to be successful leaders in our Church and in our nation. The expectation is that this initiative will lead to more sustained academic growth because of the increase in time on task that the extended year brings. Teachers will have more time to devote to the curriculum, which will lead to more in-depth exploration and enrichment in the classroom. We are very excited that the Catholic elementary schools in Los Angeles are taking a leadership role by embracing an extended year."

From Deacon Don's Desk:

Attn: you intelligent Catholics, it's about education. Last Saturday's paper had a story about a Chinese Christian seeking asylum in the U.S. The judge questioned him to see if he was a Christian by asking if "Thanksgiving was a

Christian boliday." He said, "Yes" and the judge said it was **not** a Christian holiday. You and I would argue that and send the judge to China. That same night I turned on EWTN and Fr. Corapi was questioning an engaged couple. He asked them, "What are the ten Commandments?" The young girl asked, "Do they have to be in order?" He smiled and said, "Yes." How well do we recall these basic commandments?

This Monday is the feast day of St. John Bosco, patron of printers and young apprentices. He did not believe in corporal punishment and removed temptations of sin by removing the young boys from those types of surroundings. Plus he required frequent reception of two sacraments, Penance and Holy Communion. By the way, what's the third commandment? Work, study including catechism, and play in that order was the way he incorporated the spiritual life. He educated the whole person. He founded the Salesians in 1859, now numbering 16,200, focusing on education and mission work. Wealthy patrons donated funds for two workshops for boys that included shoemaking and tailoring. Later he added a printing press for publishing catechetical pamphlets. He didn't forget the girls; he founded the Salesian Sisters.

P.S. The Chinese Christian was given a reprieve when in the appeal it was noted that George Washington and Abraham Lincoln both referred to God in their Thanksgiving messages.

Our Prayer: Lord, You called John Bosco to be a teacher to the young. Fill us with love like his so we may give ourselves completely to Your service for the salvation of souls. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen

Scripture Focus: The Beatitudes, which we hear in this Gospel passage, are the heart of the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus says that the ones who will be "happy" are those whom society has judged unhappy, even wretched. "The poor in spirit" see through the illusion of wealth and, with nothing else to rely on, come to depend on God. The sorrowing bemoan the sad state of a world that neglects God's wishes. The meek and lowly do not presume to act independently of God. Christians seek happiness by striving to imitate God's readiness to forgive. They are called to be single-hearted in doing God's will rather than making self-interest their primary motivation. They must make peace, doing everything in their power to bring this blessing that God holds out to people.
