From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

"You are the salt of the earth," Jesus tells his followers in today's Gospel reading. "But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot."

Jesus suggests that we as God's people should add some strong flavor to our world. We should make a difference. If salt loses its flavor, it is useless. If we lose the ability to change and to influence the world, we lose what is at the heart of being Christian. We are not meant to just look good. From Deacon Don's Desk:

I like numbers. You know the 10 Commandments and the 6 Precepts of the Church, but did you know that there are over 60 beatitudes in the Hebrew Scriptures? And that there are over 37 in the New Testament? A beatitude is an

expression of praise or congratulations. Wisdom has the most beatitudes. Check out Psalm 112:1 and 1:1, Proverbs 3:13 and 14:21. "How happy the one whom God reproves; therefore do not despise the discipline of the Almighty." Job 5:17 It was once said that the Beatitudes are a blueprint for disciples and the "charter document" of the kingdom.

This Sunday's Gospel says, "You are the light of the world." You've heard my story before of the English writer (circa 1850), John Ruskin. Well, I'll tell it again: He is sitting with a friend at a sidewalk café. It is dusk. The lamplighter is busy lighting the street lamps. He wends his way up a winding road. You don't see him any longer but he leaves lights burning. "There," John Ruskin says to his friend, "That is what I mean when I speak of a Christian, he leaves a light wherever he goes." Can we say that about ourselves? Has someone ever said, "I'm happy you were here." When were you able to brighten someone's day? See the Scripture Focus for other related questions. Our Prayer: Lord, make us Your holy people, light for the world to see. Make us Your living voice and Your bread broken for others, shared until all are fed. Let us be servants to one another making Your kingdom come. Amen

Scripture Focus: Isaiah reminds the people that if they learn to care for one another, they will be able to receive God's care. Their rituals must express a genuine conversion of their hearts. They cannot fast expecting to twist God's arm. Jesus likewise calls his followers to conduct their lives so that they will call attention to the presence of God within them. Salt, light and a city on a hill are clear ways to show what this message means.
