From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Righteousness in the language of the Old Testament is the term that the Jews used for fidelity to the Torah or the Word of God. It is the observance of doing the right thing or taking the right path shown by God by following the Ten Command-

ments.

The term in the New Testament that corresponds with the concept of righteousness in the Old Testament is faith. Jesus tells us that our righteousness should surpass that of the scribes and Pharisees. He also tells us that if someone has anything against us that we should choose to take the initiative and go first and be reconciled.

My hope for each of us is that we come to know more deeply that for us as Christians, faith is walking with Christ, in whom the whole law is fulfilled. And may we remember always that it is our faith that unites us with the righteousness of Christ himself.
