From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Decisions that we make always require us to leave something behind in our life. For instance, if we decide to leave our home in search of a better life, or for a better job, often it is with great pain that we leave many people and things behind. So

these decisions should only be made after much preparation, reflection and formation. But when things are done without much thought or on an impulse, then it could easily bring down everything else around us. So how then can we build a house on solid rock like today's Gospel asks us to? With prayer, preparation and a solid formation, because they give us the instruments needed for a good reflection. We always need to prepare for things in life because we never stop learning.

Good decisions aren't spontaneous. They always require discernment, especially when the decision has to do with following Christ. If we make an instant decision during a moment of enthusiasm and eagerness, but without a foundation of prayer and without thinking about the consequences, everything could all come down around us at any given moment.

We need to think about the consequences of following Christ: living a life "not for us, but for Him." Living, like Christ, a life in the service of others, which may require lots of personal sacrifice; a life of honesty in our job, of fidelity to our commitments, of dedication to our families, even when the current trend may be going another way. And the good news of the Gospel is that in return we receive the fullness of life that Christ promises each of us.

The past few weeks have been spent reviewing the Schoolwide Learning Expectations (SLE's) for St. Joseph Elementary School. These are the benchmarks we expect our eighth graders to do, know and understand by the time they graduate from this school. Upon



graduation the students move on to begin their high school educational years where we have found that the majority of them flourish and excel. About half of our graduates attend local Catholic schools: St. John Bosco, St. Joseph, and St. Anthony High Schools. Often there is one or two that attend Catholic high schools in the Diocese of Orange such as Mater Dei, Servite, Rosary or Connolly, For those students entering public high schools, there are generally 2-4 students that go into the Poly Pace program (notably the top academic program in LBUSD) and others in the Millikan Quest and Wilson Distinguished Scholars programs. We are extremely proud that in the last four years ten St. Joseph graduates have been high school valedictorians from St. John Bosco, Poly (Pace Program), Wilson and Los Alamitos High Schools. If I seem to be bragging a little – I AM! Have you thought about a Catholic education for your child?
