From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Jesus' continuous call to conversion is especially heard during Lent. There is something about being away from home that is not pleasant. Whether we are on a business trip, or on a vacation, we always long for what we have left behind. At home we

have what is ours, our memories, our loved ones, our roots. In it we find safety, comfort, and a sense of belonging.

Sometimes we might think that life would be a lot easier if we just "packed up and moved" somewhere else. In our spiritual life, that is what sin wants to make us think, that life away from God and God's people will be a lot easier and a better life. And yet when we let sin guide our coming and our going, we find ourselves at a place that is not home. We feel badly and we long to go back where we are always welcomed, supported, and loved.

Sin might lead us away from our home in God, yet it can never remove us beyond God's reach and love. In the same way a father and mother can see into the heart of his or her child, and see the goodness that is there, God sees us in the same way in spite of our sins and faults.

During Lent it is important for us to learn that these forty days invite us to get on the road that leads us back to our home, the road that leads us back to our God.
