### From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Every Lent we begin a journey in communion with the whole church. In the desert last weekend we saw Jesus tempted to abandon his true mission. Today we stand on the mountaintop with Jesus' closest companions as he is revealed to them in

the mystery of his divine nature. As we celebrate our Eucharist this weekend we recognize the risen Lord in our midst, in the bread and wine transformed into the bread of life and the cup of salvation.

If we want to see the Lord's relationship in our own lives transformed and strengthened, then we have to recognize the need to become single-minded like the best of those athletes who compete in the Olympics. We need to have the strength to make tough choices. When we are able to do that, then we will reap the benefits.

Leftovers from last week's homily. If you forgot what was said: all you need to do is reach in your pocket and take out a U.S. coin. Now read the inscription. Yes, it says, "In God we trust." It's all about **trust** that God knows what's best

for us. Persevere in prayer. "Be still and know that I am the Lord." Maury Wills, in his first pro tryout camp, was told, "Go home, forget about big league baseball. You are too small." He didn't go home and did not forget about baseball. For eight years he worked hard in the minors. "I came close to quitting 100 times, but I stuck with it." The Dodgers took a chance in 1959. In 1962, he stole 104 bases, hit .299 and beat out Willie Mays for MVP.

That's how our Lenten prayer life should be: steadfast, don't give up. Put away the cell phone, Blackberry, iPhone, iPad, etc. and extend a little courtesy to God. Lent is that time. Don't ignore Him. He's listening.
