Scripture Focus: The themes of light and seeing come up again and again in today's readings. In the first reading Samuel is reminded to see others through God's eyes; "Not as (a human being) sees does God see, because (a human being) sees the appearance, but the Lord looks into the heart." And the whole drama of today's Gospel revolves around those who see and those who fail to see. Sight in this story becomes a symbol of belief. Blindness is about more than just not being able to see with the eyes; it's about the refusal to believe.

Life Focus: * Speak of a time when simple or broken people saw things more clearly than the people who seem to have it all together. * Talk about an experience when healing or insight came in an unexpected way.

* Relate an experience when you were blind to God's love. * Relate an experience when your everyday rules and routines have kept you from "seeing" God. * Name a time when someone helped you change a negative attitude. * How have you reached out to share your faith and love with people around you? * Describe an experience when because of a difficult time your faith was affected (for better or worse).
