From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

This Sunday, the Second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate "Divine Mercy Sunday." The Gospel today tells us about one of the Post-Resurrection appearances of Jesus to his disciples, where Jesus appears to his disciples, coming through locked

doors, and says, "Peace be with you" breathing upon them the Holy Spirit and communicating His authority to forgive sins.

But, Thomas wasn't there. So the other disciples tell him later, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Then a week later Thomas was with the other disciples and Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" When that doubting disciple touched his Master's wounded flesh he became a witness to the reality of the resurrection. We are also invited to become living witnesses in our own day to the reality of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Today we join with our Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI and Catholics throughout the whole world, in celebrating the Feast of Divine Mercy. To Saint Faustina Our Lord said: "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of my mercy." My hope for each of us is that we approach the throne of Mercy with a humble confidence and like St. Thomas we also can say, "My Lord and My God."

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: Today's readings center on faith. Acts tells us the early community of believers took the gospel to heart and formed their lives on its message. Peter writes to encourage the newly baptized Christians who faced hostility. And the Gospel tells the story of Thomas. He insists upon physical evidence before he believes. He doubts, but Jesus knows this and speaks to him through his doubts. He recognizes Thomas as one who can believe and he calls him to faith. The gospel writer encourages his audience to believe in Jesus even though they haven't actually seen him.

Life Focus: * When did you believe because of a sign and not by faith? * Name a time when you believed by faith. * Share an experience when you hesitated to admit that you were a Catholic. * Relate a time when you overcame your doubts and became stronger in your relationship with God. * When have you ever felt "sent" by the Lord? * Relate a time when you did something to help strengthen someone's' belief. * What hinders you from believing in Jesus? * Do you ever identify with Thomas in your spiritual life, & how do you handle periods of doubt?

From Deacon Don's Desk:

What kind of witness for the faith is St. Joseph parish? Would the way we practice our **faith** give anyone **reason** to believe? St. Thomas wanted **proof** even though there was plenty of **reason** when the women said to him: "We have seen the Lord!"

Would a religion that has lasted centuries, produced thousands of martyrs, not be reason to at least want to investigate that religion? Fr. Ken Roberts wrote, "**Faith** is believing something you can't prove but 'not without **reason**' we must have a reason for **faith**." He goes on to say, "What if you don't want to study Church history? What if you want to make your decision on the witness of today's Catholics? What kind of witness would you be?"

When I witnessed Debbi Leveque's tears as Fr Jim said to her "Body of Christ" and she said "Amen" and received Jesus for the first time, a great joy came over me. She observed, she questioned, she believes. Her "Amen" was said with great joy.

As I write this, it was announced that Mary Dondero has been called by God. Mary taught us the true gift of Eucharist. Sundays and even Stations of the Cross were her passion. As a nurse she was at Tina's side for the delivery of our children. I recall late one evening in the maternity room she brought me a mattress & blanket - always thinking of others.

OUR PRAYER: Lord, You wash away our sins in water, redeem us in the blood of Jesus and give us a new birth in the Spirit. In celebrating Your Son's resurrection, increase our witness of these blessings and renew Your gift of life within us. Amen.
